8. Weather: Generally fair and presented no problem during the period.
9. Supply: No shortage of T/E equipment for this Bn. Due to considerable moving there was some shortage of gasoline. Ten and One ration has been the issue supplemented with issues of fresh meat and bread.
10. Communications: Very satisfactory. Telephone service was provided for Bn Hq through-out period. Communication by ambulance and Motor Messenger were normal.
11. Morale: Generally excellent, during this period personnel from Hq Det voluntarily assisted as litter bearers when needed in the Clearing Sta. Nearly all personnel have rendered valuable services not required in their assigned duties.
12. Casualties: During the period this Battalion had the following casualties:

- 2 EM - Killed in action.  
 3 EM - Wounded in action, dropped from assignment.  
 2 EM - Injured in action, dropped from assignment.  
 1 EM - Injured in action, not dropped from assignment.  
 2 EM - Slightly wounded in action, dropped from assignment in July, returned to duty in August.

- 13.. Decorations: Tec 5 George F. Josse, 37550732, Company B, was awarded the Bronze Star Medal for heroic service in connection with military operations against an enemy in the vicinity of \* \* \* Normandy, France, on 5 August 1944. Copy of order with inclosures.

- 14.. Decisive exploits: Captain FREDERICK S. WEBSTER, 0370294, MC, CO Coll Co A, has been recommended for Silver Star Award, for heroic action and complete disregard for his personal safety under enemy and friendly fire on 09 August 1944, near Mortain, France, resulting in the evacuation of 59 casualties and the discovery of a supply route for two isolated Bns of this Division.

- 15.. Prisoners taken: No prisoners were taken by this unit, however a total of 135 wounded prisoners were treated at the Clearing Station and were evacuated to higher medical installations.

- 16.. Summary: This Division joined the XII Corps and Third Army 13 August 1944.

The third platoon of 16 Field Hospital moved into the Clearing Station area 21 Aug. 44. The third platoon of 16 Field Hospital was followed by the third platoon of the 60 Field Hospital. This platoon arrived at 2300 31 Aug 44.

The Battalion Executive Officer and S-3 continued their assistance in the Clr Sta.
