8. Weather: Generally fair and presented no problem during the period.
9. Supply: There were no major shortages in TE.  
 Adequate supplies were available to this unit.  
 Rations have improved considerably during this period.
10. Communications: Very satisfactory. Telephone service was provided for Bn Hq. through-out period. Communication by ambulance and Motor Messenger were normal.
11. Morale: Generally excellent, during this period personnel from Company D and Headquarters Detachment voluntarily acted as litter bearers during the influx of heavy casualties. Nearly all personnel have rendered valuable services not required in their assigned duties.
12. Casualties: During the period this Battalion had the following casualties:
  - Battle
    - 2 EM - Killed in action
    - 7 EM - Wounded in action
    - 6 EM- Sick, non-battle
  - 2 of EM wounded remained on duty.
  - 3 Non-battle returned to duty.
  - 2 EM wounded in action are still in Clearing Station being treated.

14. Decisive exploits: Litter Squads and Technicians from Collecting Companies went forward of the Battalion Aid Station to assist in first echelon treatment and evacuation of the wounded. Additional litter squads were loaned to us from V Corps.
15. Prisoners taken: No prisoners were taken by this unit, however a total of 23 wounded prisoners were treated at the Clearing Station. 22 were evacuated to higher medical installations and one was sent to a PW Enclosure under Military Police escort.
16. Summary: This Division transferred from the XIX Corps to the V Corps as of 0001 27 July 1944. First Platoon of 51st Field Hospital moved into the Clearing Station area 200 29 July and were established at 1000 30 July.
- The Battalion Executive Officer and S-3 are still assisting in the Clearing Station. Litter Bearers and Technicians are still going forward of Battalion Aid Stations to evacuate and treat wounded personnel.
- During a portion of this period Company B joined a task force commanded by General Seabree.
