SUBJECT: Report After Action Against Enemy.

TO : The Adjutant General,  
Washington, 25, D. C.

1. In compliance with the provisions of Par 10, G3, AR 345-105, submitted below is report after action against the enemy for the 110th Medical Battalion covering the period 1-31 May 1945.

May 1 to 18, 1945. Incl.

The 110th Medical Battalion maintained its position in the 35th Infantry Division. The Division still assigned to the XIII Corps and Ninth U. S. Army. All units of the Battalion located in Springe, Germany. The Division is not in contact with the enemy and Battalion training is stressing physical fitness and care of equipment.

Clearing Station operating and processing Division and attached units personnel both sick and injured. Collecting Companies doing the evacuation both from the Aid Stations back to the Clearing and Clearing Station back to higher Medical installations. During this first part of the period there were two hundred and fifty three patients from the Division and twenty-four from other units not attached handled through the Clearing Station. In addition there were several German Military Hospitals checked and the patients from some were evacuated by the Collecting Company's ambulances to larger hospitals.

May 19 to 31, 1945. Incl.

On the 18th of May the Battalion moved by motor with the units locating as follows; Hq and Hq Det, Companies C and D at Nordkirchen, Company A at Kapelle and Company B at Hebern. On the 19th the Division was relieved from duty with the XIII Corps and assigned to the XVI Corps. The Medical officers not being used to operate the Clearing Station were organized into teams for checking D. P. camps within the Division area. Hospitals were checked and patients transferred by ambulance between different hospitals. During this latter part of the period there were one hundred and forty-four patients from the Division, nine from other units not attached and four Allies handled through the Clearing Station.
