INTRODUCTORY: This report covers the factual account of the operations of this headquarters in combat from 7 July 1944 to 31 July 1944, and based on a day by day account covers as completely as available the S-1, S-2, S-3, S-4, Anti-Tank Section, Air Liaison Section, and Operations for the above period. No attempt will be made to cover operations of attached organic and separate battalions other than operations in general which this headquarters is concerned with.

1500 6TH JULY 1944

This unit embarked on LST's, with TE and TO on 6th of July 1944 at 1500 from Portland Weymouth, England, and sailed for the coast of Normandy, being enroute until 1500 7th July 1944. No unusual events occurred during the short sea voyage.

7TH JULY 1944

Disembarking at approximately 1700 this unit moved by infiltration 2 miles to an assembly area in Normandy near "Omaha" Beach and proceeded to take the waterproofing from the vehicles. During this period reconnaissance was made for a bivouac area in the vicinity of Colombres, Normandy France

and the unit made a night march 10 miles to this point, arriving 0300
8th July 1944.

8TH JULY 1944

Division Artillery spent the day on administrative plans, orientation to plans of the FUSA, and along with the 35th Division was placed in Reserve by FUSA, with mission to remain in present bivouac positions, complete administrative details, dewaterproofing, and final preparations for combat. All battalions of the Division Artillery were bivouaced vic. Southeast Colombres. Division Artillery Air Liaison Section was also in this vicinity having crossed the channel by air.

9TH JULY 1944

The 35th Infantry Division was alerted for movement, assigned to the XIX Corps, operating in the vicinity North of St. Lo, France, and moved 10 miles into positions by truck arriving at 1630 into CP West of Moon-sur-elle, France with the 30th Division on the right and the 29th Division on the left. Battalions of Division Artillery moved into general area West of St. Clair sur L'Elle and took survey direction from the 29th Division Artillery. The Division took over the general sector occupied by the 175th Infantry of the 29th Division and Division Artillery was prepared to fire in the area to the North West of St Lo to the Vire River, with Battalions under Division Artillery control. Air Liaison Section, referred to as AOP, was in the same vicinity.

10TH JULY 1944

The Division Artillery remained under Division Artillery Control and received and fired call missions during the day on enemy batteries and strong points, in general preparation for the attack. A total of 1664 rounds were fired up to 0600 11 July 1944.

11TH JULY 1944

A total of 8,191 rounds were fired by organic battalions. General Division Artillery plan for attack 219th direct support of 137th Inf, 216th

direct support of 320th Inf, with 161st reinforcing the 216th and 127th counterbattery and reinforce fires of 216th. All battalions on call for fires from this headquarters.

12TH JULY 1944

Organic Battalions remained with above missions of supporting the general attack of the 35th Infantry Division. Four batteries of 448th AAA were attached to this headquarters, and attached further as follows: A Btry with 216th, B Btry with 161st, C Btry with 127th, D Btry with 219th. The 654th TD Battalion (Minus B Btry) was attached this headquarters and assigned as follows: A with 219th, C with 127th, the CP being located near this headquarters. Normal defensive fires were fired from 0001B to 0700, consisting of harassing and interdiction fires. A 30 minute preparation for the attack was made by the direct support and reinforcing battalions. Twelve Counter-battery missions were dired and 10 division artillery concentrations were fired. A total of 7,542 rounds were fired.

The AT Section during this period coordinated the 57mm AT guns of the division to protect the front and the flanks from any possible tank thrust. The 654th TD at this time in addition to the indirect fire missions as assigned to battalions was coordinated with AT guns with reference to possible tank thrust. The 448th AAA with its 40mm was used to protect the Division CP and organic battalions and with secondary mission of AT defense. The AT also coordinated the movements of the 35th Division Engineers in preparing road blocks and demolitions for roads leading into the division area. Bridges along the Vire River were prepared for demolition in case of a tank thrust by the enemy.

13TH JULY 1944

Baker Btry 654th TD was assigned to this headquarters and further attached to the 161st FA Bn. Two platoons of D Co 654th TD were used in strong point assaults by the 320th Inf. The strong point consisting of the church, chateau at La Meauffe, which was by-passed by the 157th Inf was

 effective demolished by 980 rounds of artillery fire including 20 rounds of
 8 inch Howitzer. Rounds expended 12,927 for Division Artillery. Missions
 of organic battalions remained the same. P.W.'s captured later confirmed
 the devastating effect of the artillery fire both at La Meauffe and on
 the rest of the front.

14TH JULY 1944

The 92nd Chemical Battalion was attached to this headquarters and
 further attached to the 161st FA Bn at 141200B. The Division Artillery
 continued the mission of supporting the Division attack with 137th Infantry
 making the main effort. A 30 minute preparation in support of this main
 effort was fired by the 216th, 219th, and 161st. This preparation was on
 heavily fortified and dug in strong points East of the Vire River. The
 963rd FA (155 ML) was attached to this headquarters and further attached
 to the 127th FA Bn effective 141200. The 161st FA Bn occupied positions
 in vicinity of Villers-Fossard, Normandy, the 963rd vicinity St Clair
 sur E'lle, and the 92nd Chemical Battalion vicinity Seguiville, Normandy,
 France. A total of 6,782 rounds were fired. Continuous air surveillance was
 maintained each day from dawn to dark by at least one plane in the air
 all the time. Observers silenced enemy batteries and targets of opportunity.

15TH JULY 1944

Division Artillery continued in support of the attack with the 30th
 Division on the right and the 29th Division on the left. TD batteries
 were used for harrassing fires during the night. There were no tactical changes
 in artillery grouping. A total of 11,299 rounds were fired by Division
 Artillery.

16TH JULY 1944

The 92nd Chemical Battalion was relieved from Division Artillery at
 1000. Organic battalions fired normal call missions from Division Artillery
 and Infantry. Infantry met strongly fortified dug in defensive positions.

The artillery as well as the infantry were beginning to realize the need for the Liaison planes for observation, location and firing on enemy batteries. The problem of OP's remained ever constant, observation usually on the ground being limited from one hedge row to the next. The 127th FA Bn occupied positions in the vicinity 800 yards NW of Segueville. A total of 2,647 rounds were fired.

17TH JULY 1944

The drive along the general Division Area continued toward St Lo, wiping out the pocket that existed to the North West of St Lo. All AT Guns were coordinated with platoons of the 654th TD as support in the event of any tank threat. The TD platoons were used as close support weapons with the infantry to blast holes in the hedgerows. The 654th is credited with knocking out a German CP during the period. Artillery groupment remained the same. Battalions were on call to Division Artillery and supported the Infantry attack. Harrassing and interdiction fires along with counterbattery occupied the night. During this period more counterbattery fire was occurring, possibly to cover a withdrawal from St Lo. Enemy battery lists were increased by Air OP spotters, PW reports, Photo Interpretation, and G-2 channels. Shell-Reps were found very valuable in suppling Corps Artillery Sound Flash units. Some artillery units found location almost possible by listening for the actual firing of the gun, counting the seconds and getting an approximate direction to the gun. Many reports confirmed the use of roving guns, often one or two at a time changing location after firing a few rounds. It is thought the Germans usually precede a withdrawal with heavy artillery fire. A total of 2,682 rounds were fired during the period.

18TH JULY 1944

Organic battalions reverted to CT control on call to Division Artillery with 127th FA Bn and 963rd FA in general support. Co C, 654th TD was relieved from attachment to 127th FA Bn and attached to 216th FA Bn. The 216th FA Bn

fired 20 rounds of propaganda below St Lo South of the Vire River. Normal fires in defense and counterbattery and harrassing fires were carried on during the night. Division Artillery with organic battalions prepared to displace forward. Only 545 rounds were fired during the period.

19th JULY 1944

With the capture of St Lo by leading elements of the 29th Division the 35th Infantry Division was commended by the XIX Corps for the part the 35th played in the capture of the important communications center. The 29th Division was relieved and the 35th Division took over the entire sector North, Northeast and Northwest of St Lo. The 29th Division Artillery remained in its present positions and was reverted to 35th Division Artillery control. The division meanwhile took up a defensive position all along the front and prepared to hold the ground north of St Lo. The withdrawal of the 29th Infantry Division placed the 2nd Division V Corps on the Division left flank. The following artillery plan was put in effect for the defense and an elaborate defensive fire system was organized. The 216th FA Bn reinforced the fires of the 219th FA Bn, in direct support of the 137th Infantry; the 161st FA Bn in direct support of the 134th, 110th FA (29th Div) in general support reinforcing the fires of the 161st; 224th FA (29th Div) in direct support of the 320th (Liaison Sections and forward observers to be furnished by 216th of the CT 320th); the 127th with 963rd attached in general support; the 111th FA (29th Div) in general support reinforcing the fires of the 224th FA Bn; the 227th (29th Div Arty) with attached 967th FA in general support. All organic and attached battalions were prepared to mass fires in St Lo Area. The 35th AT defended the 137th and 134th areas, the 29th Div Arty AT in defense of the 320th. AT guns were placed as close as possible to the front lines to ward off any possible counterattacks by armored units. There was a general withdrawal under cover of darkness by the enemy during the period. Only 289 rounds were fired.

20TH JULY 1944

Normal defensive fire plan remained in effect, with some counterbattery and interdiction in the defense of the area north of St Lo. Enemy troops occupying high ground directly West of St Lo brought several fire missions from observers North of the Vire who could observe enemy movements. There were no changes in attachments and 519 rounds were fired by Division Artillery. The 216th occupied positions vicinity of le Mesnil-Rouxelin, France, the 161st vicinity 600 yards SE Villers Fossard, 219th FA Bn vicinity Le Meauffe, and the 963rd FA vicinity La Forge.

21ST JULY 1944

Counterbattery fires and normal defensive fires remained in effect in entire sector. The 161st FA Bn fired in support of the 134th Infantry, mopping up the remnants of resistance in St. Lo and South of St Lo. During the period 641 rounds were fired. This unit moved five miles to vicinity Villers Fossard by truck.

22ND JULY 1944

Special fires requested by G-2, 35th Infantry Division were fired by all organic battalions on area targets South of St Lo including bridges over the Vire. Twelve and thirteen battalion concentrations TOT(time on target) were not uncommon. There was no change in the Artillery plan. Normal defensive plan still in effect. The 127th FA Bn occupied positions vicinity 300 yards SE Le Mesnil-Rouxelin. During the period 661 rounds were fired by Division Artillery.

23RD JULY 1944

There was no change in the general plan of defense. The 127th FA Bn moved and occupied positions vicinity LaRaoulerie. There were 364 rounds fired by Division Artillery.

24TH JULY 1944

A plan of fires was established in support of the attack by the 30th

Infantry Division on the right. The 35th Division remained in defense. The 216th FA Bn moved to positions vicinity LaBlotrie and the 219th FA Bn vicinity La Fossardiers. There were 1106 rounds fired.

25TH JULY 1944

Organic artillery fired rearmament and neutralization and interdiction fires in support of the 30th Infantry Division. There were 1,062 rounds fired.

26TH JULY 1944

The 111th FA reinforced the fires of the 2nd Division Artillery, the 216th FA Bn reinforced fires of the 161st FA Bn in support of 137th Inf, 110th reinforced fires of the 224th in direct support of 320th Inf. The 219th FA Bn was in direct support of the 137th Inf. The 793rd, 227th, 127th, and 963rd were in general support, the 963rd being on call to XIX Corps for counterbattery missions. A total of 966 rounds were fired.

27TH JULY 1944

The 29th Division Artillery was relieved from attachment to 35th Division Artillery effective 272200 and withdrew from the sector. For the attack to the south of St Lo the following artillery plan was effected. The 161st FA Bn in direct support of 134th Inf, 216th FA Bn, 219th FA Bn, 110th, and 224th reinforced the fires of the 161st FA Bn. The 127th and 227th in general support reinforcing 161st. 963rd FA was reverted to XIX control in present positions. The 35th Division AT to take over from 821st TD (attached to 29th Div). The 459th AAA and 621st TD was relieved from attachment to 35th Infantry Division. A total of 736 rounds was fired.

28TH JULY 1944

The 161st FA Bn moving to vicinity South East St Lo was in direct support of 134th Inf, 219th FA Bn reinforce fires of 161st FA Bn, and 216th FA Bn direct support 320th Inf. There was only scattered resistance through sector. The 35th Division was attached to V Corps. There were 540 rounds fired. All operations so far were conducted mainly by telephone

with wire communication. There were no communication problems other than the current and everpresent ones. Radio's were only used in emergency.

29TH JULY 1944

All elements of Division Artillery moved to the South of St Lo during the period. This unit occupied position to the South East of St Lo, the 161st FA Bn vicinity La Bourdonnerie, the 127th FA Bn vicinity 900 yards South of La Rocque, 219th FA Bn vicinity of Fumichon, and the 216th FA Bn vicinity of Boulogny. Twelve missions were fired by Division Artillery during the period and the artillery supported the attack of the Division. The air field moved to vicinity les Foulons. A total of 566 rounds was fired.

30TH JULY 1944

The 186th FA (155 ML) with Btry B 941st FA attached was attached by V Corps Artillery to the 35th Division Artillery effective 292400. Btry B 116th AAA (90mm) was attached to 35th Division Artillery at 292400 and with mission of accomplishing anti-aircraft protection and secondary mission of interdiction and counterbattery. Btry B 116th AAA occupied positions near 127th FA Bn. Division Artillery supported the attack of the 35th Infantry Division. CT direct support with exception of 219th FA Bn which supported and reinforced the fires of the 216th, 127th in general support and 186th reinforce 161st FA Bn. Division artillery fired 131 missions including 24 counterbatterys. Division artillery was regrouped by this headquarters at 1800 as follows; 161st FA Bn direct support 134th Inf, making main effort; 219th FA Bn reinforce 161st, 186th reinforce 161st, 127th reinforce 161st and in general support, with the 216th in direct support of 320th. The 186th FA moved to vicinity of Gosville, Normandy France. A total of 1947 rounds was fired.

31ST JULY 1944

Division Artillery was regrouped for the attack as follows: The 161st direct support 134th, the 219th direct support of 137th Ct Task Force, 186th and 127th reinforcing fires of 219th, and 216th direct support of 320th.

The 216th FA Bn moved to vicinity La Guerardiere, the 219th FA Bn vicinity St Suzanne sur Vire, the 161st FA Bn vicinity Le Hamel, the 127th FA Bn vicinity La Rue. This unit moved to vicinity East Conde Sur Vire. A total of 2,827 rounds were fired, bringing the monthly total to 66,503.

General: Morale of this headquarters is excellent among the men and the officers. The men and officers of this command are fitted both physically and mentally for any problems or situations that may face them, either as a unit or as individuals in performance of their duties.

The 35th Division Artillery Air Liaison Section with ten planes left July 7, 1944 1600 from Ibsley Field, Army Air Base, England and landed in France at Army Air Strip near "Omaha" Beach in Normandy. The trip was uneventful. The planes were then flown to 23 MM and R operated by FUSA. Reconnaissance was made the following day and an air strip selected near Colombres to which the unit moved July 8, 1944. July 9, 1944 the Air Section moved to the vicinity of Division Headquarters near Moon-sur-Eille, France. On the 22nd of July the Air Section moved to the vicinity 1000 meters North of Villers Fossard, followed July 30, 1944 to a field South East of St Lo, France.
