Captured near Mortain on 8 Aug 1944. Our tank was hit and set fire, and the Sgt gave the order to get out. I think the rest of the crew got out safely, but did not see any of them. I was taken PW soon after that, and then overrun by the Canadians on 19 Aug 1944 in the same area.
