
MISCELLANEOUS:-

A raid was held in NEUWIED F8003 on 7 July 1945. One entire block in the city was searched. The house of Heinrich Avicius was found to contain numerous art treasures - Avicius is held in jail by MG. The house of Dr. Rudolf Ruppert vicinity RHEINBREITBACH F6424 was found to contain numerous art treasures - all the occupants of this house were placed under house arrest and military police were posted.

TRAVEL SECURITY IN GERMANY -

Service Personnel - Supreme Headquarters, AEF, letter, AG 311.7-1 GBI-AGM, subject "Carriage of Personal Mail", dated 4 August 1944, provides that the carriage to and from Northwest Europe of letters, memoranda, diaries, photographs or other personal documents or papers by other than approved APO channels is strictly forbidden, unless such matter has been pre-censored by a military base censor or by British or U. S. Traveller's Censorship.

Civilians - Military Government (Germany) Law No. 76 provides that "all correspondence, personal papers and documents carried by civilian travellers are

subject to censorship". Violation of this law renders the offender liable to punishment by Military Government court.

COMMITTEE ON CAPTURED ENEMY ELECTRONICS

The Committee on Captured Enemy Electronics for technical intelligence purposes has stated that a wide spread policy is now noticeable for destruction of this equipment. It is requested that action be taken to prevent premature destruction of following equipment, pending the issuance of a list of equipment which may be destroyed: Infra red; proximity fuses; radar communication; other electronic equipment.

WANTED PERSON

PFALSDORF, Josef Dr - former address: Altkirchen/Westerwald, Parkstrasse 44, age 50. Dr. Pfalsdorf left Frankenberg about 14 June to return to his home in Altkirchen/Westerwald Parkstrasse 44. Reason wanted: SS Stabsarzt, was a close friend of Dr. Braun, Gestapo Doctor of Frankenberg who committed suicide when Allied troops entered the town.



# NEWS HIGHLIGHTS 10 JULY 1945

## PACIFIC

More than 1,000 American carrier aircraft have attacked airfields around TOKYO. The attack was reported still in full swing after eight hours. It achieved complete surprise. The task force included 4 big carriers, the super-battleship, Iowa, 2 heavy battleships, 4 cruisers and 14 destroyers. Earlier 550 superforts dropped 3,500 tons of bombs on 5 Japanese towns. Thirty-four Japanese towns and cities have now been blitzed.

American aircraft from OKINAWA have already sunk some 160 ships and damaged nearly 200. Heavy and medium bombers have stepped up the air onslaught on FORMOSA. (See Map - No. 1)

Chinese troops have recaptured an American airfield in SOUTH CHINA and a strategic pass on the INDO-CHINA frontier.

Netherlands East Indies troops have landed at 2 new points on BORNEO N of BALIKAPAPAN BAY.

## GERMANY

The equipment and formulas of the German Farben Industrie are to be used against JAPAN. Products only suitable for the Wehrmacht will be destroyed.

BERLIN is to be administered by a council of the British, American, Russian and French Military Governors to be called the Kommandantura. It will meet tomorrow for the first time.

## UNITED STATES

President Truman has left Virginia by sea for the Big Three meeting accompanied by many advisors.

## RUSSIA

Generalissimo Stalin has had a third meeting with the Chinese Premier Dr. Soong.
