1. ENEMY SITUATION AT END OF PERIOD:

- Enemy front line - The enemy front line extends along the E bank of the ELBE RIVER.
- Defensive organization - The enemy is dug in on E bank of ELBE RIVER opposite TANGERMUNDE Y8747.
- Units in contact - Elements of enemy units are still being encountered as reported in OB Estimate of 14 April.
- Artillery - No artillery fire was reported on our units in the sector.

2. ENEMY OPERATIONS DURING PERIOD:

- General summary - No organized resistance was offered by the enemy. Groups of enemy troops surrendered upon contact today.
- Operations of component elements:
 - Artillery - No new battery positions located during period.
 - Aviation - One ME-262 flew over sector from W to E at 0704. One FW-190 was shot down vicinity Y255328 at 0737. Pilot was taken prisoner after reaching ground by parachute.
 - Engineers - Bridge at TANGERMUNDE Y8747 has been demolished. A minefield reported on both sides of road at Y7750.
 - Infantry - 600 enemy troops at GARDELEGEN Y4743 negotiated a surrender at 151130W.
 - Miscellaneous - PW who had been on E side of river reports that some tanks and artillery are moving into the woods at Y9249.

3. MISCELLANEOUS:

- Prisoners - 618 PWs passed thru Div care since 141800P. Total for this operation 1,094. Grand total 22,008.
- Miscellaneous - A number of hospitals, ammo dumps, AA guns, railroad guns, and planes have come into our possession as a result of this operation. 25 enemy planes in good condition were captured at Y8327. A train loaded with 30 to 40 V-2s was captured at Y785390.
 All persons wearing German uniforms are to be picked up and evacuated thru PW channels regardless of any arm band they may be wearing. Any enemy weapons found stacked along roads are to be inspected by competent personnel to determine whether they are loaded before being picked up and evacuated.
 Three PWs were ambushed and killed after dark at SHALCHAU Y6134 on 14 April. An officer was killed in another ambush at crossroads Y7435 after dark on 14 April.
- Weather - Cloudy in morning with scattered clouds in the afternoon. Occasional showers.
- Password - HALVE reply HOLE from 161200 to 171200 April 1945.
