1. COUNTERINTELLIGENCE:

COUNTERINTELLIGENCE:
Four wanted personalities arrested by GARDELEGEM agents on 6 May have escaped from the enclosure at CALBE. They are:

- the enclosure at CALBE. They are:
1. LEIBL, Hans, 23 year old Chicago-born German, speaking perfect American, fluent German. Height 6'3", weight 185, dark complexion, black hair parted on the side. This traitor returned to GERMANY in 1939, renounced his American citizenship, entered the German Army and later went on the air as a propaganda broadcaster for the German radio.
 2. KAUFFMANN, Gunther, 32 year old San Salvadorean, speaking fair English, perfect German, perfect Spanish. Height 5'7" tall, weight 165, heavy mustache, wears hair long, combed straight back, Spanish accent in English speech. This man broadcast over the German propaganda radio to Spanish-speaking nations. May be accompanied by his wife who is German, 5'3", dark hair, broad cheekbones, probably dressed in slacks.
 3. KAUFFMANN, Erich, 28 year old San Salvadorean, speaking poor English, fair French, perfect German, perfect Spanish. Height 5'8", weight 180, balding head but hair is long in back. Wears heavy tortoise shell rimmed glasses. This man broadcast in German over the BERLIN radio.
 4. CRUNAU, Lieselotte, 19 year old Guatemalan girl, speaking English with a heavy Spanish accent, perfect German, perfect Spanish, 5'4", weight 120 lbs., exceptionally attractive, well-dressed, wearing gray sport coat, gray slacks, turban. Affianced to Erich KAUFFMANN. This woman broadcast in Spanish over the German propaganda radio.

These four persons made their way from CALNE to SOLPKE, Y4140, where they picked up their bicycles last Wednesday and were making their way to a rendezvous at the Oberforstamt (Main Forestry Office) in HANE OBER. From there they were proceeding to the home of the KAUFMAN'S' mother in WIESBADEN. (See: XIII Corps G-2 Per Rpt #189)

CIC investigated in cooperation with MG an incident at the residence of Frau ZIMMERMANN, "UNDER X1801, who was the recipient of a home-made bomb wrapped in a paper package. The package was given to a small boy by a girl, whom he thought to be Polish, to be delivered to Frau Zimmerman. Upon opening the package Frau Zimmerman noticed smoke coming from it and threw it on the floor just as it burst into flames which lasted momentarily. No one was hurt. Frau Zimmerman when questioned stated that she had no known enemies. The bomb was inclosed in a hinged wooden box, equipped with a fuse operated by a trip wire which would be released upon opening the lid. However, probably due to a faulty fuse, the device broke into flame prematurely instead of exploding.
