I - AWARD OF THE BRONZE STAR MEDAL

By direction of the President and under the provisions of Circular 6, Headquarters Third United States Army, 26 April 1944, the Bronze Star Medal, for heroic achievement in connection with military operations against an armed enemy, is awarded to:

Private First Class THOMAS KEFALAS, 33694230, Cavalry, Troop B, * * * Cavalry Reconnaissance Squadron (Mechanized), Army of the United States. On the morning of 29 December 1944, Troop B, * * * Cavalry Reconnaissance Squadron (Mechanized), was ordered to attack and drive the enemy from * * *, Luxembourg. The first reconnaissance platoon was advancing on the town of * * * through a small plot of woods when the enemy laid an artillery barrage within the immediate vicinity, forcing the platoon to withdraw to the rear. During the hasty withdrawal, two light machine guns and one bazooka were left in the wooded area. In order to prevent these weapons from falling into enemy hands and being subsequently used against our own forces, Private First Class KEFALAS, with the help of an assistant, upon his own initiative, and with utter disregard for his own personal safety, re-entered the wooded area and successfully recovered the two light machine guns and the bazooka. Private First Class KEFALAS, by his fearlessness and initiative, set a high example for his comrades, and his heroic actions are illustrative of the highest traditions of the military service of the United States.


A Bronze Oak-Leaf Cluster, in addition to the Air Medal previously presented, is awarded to:
