By direction of the President and under the provisions of Circular 6, Headquarters Third United States Army, 26 April 1944, the Bronze Star Medal is awarded posthumously to:

Private STANLEY P. NEVINSKI, 35609551, Field Artillery, Headquarters Battery, 177th Field Artillery Battalion, United States Army. For meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States from 1 August 1944 to 14 October 1944.

II - AWARD OF THE BRONZE STAR MEDAL

By direction of the President and under the provisions of Circular 6, Headquarters Third United States Army, 26 April 1944, the Bronze Star Medal is awarded to:

Corporal WILLIAM A. IRVIN, JR., 33656944, Field Artillery, Battery A, 177th Field Artillery Battalion, United States Army. For heroic achievement in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States near \* \* \* , Belgium, on 10 January 1945. While Corporal IRVIN was serving in a forward observer's party with the infantry, his position was suddenly attacked by the enemy. Calmly, he fought with the infantry, firing at point-blank range at the oncoming enemy and hurling hand grenades into their midst. Even though the enemy onslaught was not stopped until it reached within ten feet of Corporal IRVIN's position, he stood fast and continued to fire until the attack was repulsed. The courageous devotion to duty, as displayed by Corporal IRVIN, is in keeping with the highest traditions of the armed forces of the United States.

III - AWARD OF THE BRONZE STAR MEDAL

By direction of the President and under the provisions of Circular 6, Headquarters Third United States Army, 26 April 1944, the Bronze Star Medal, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States during the respective periods indicated, is awarded to:

Colonel HOWARD R. MOORE, O18231, Adjutant General's Department, Headquarters III Corps, United States Army, 15 September 1944 to 18 January 1945.

Second Lieutenant RAY H. CARTER, 0536161, Field Artillery, Headquarters Battery, 176th Field Artillery Battalion, United States Army. For meritorious achievement while participating in aerial flight against an enemy over France during the period 9 November 1944 to 12 December 1944.
