I. AWARD OF BRONZE STAR MEDAL. By direction of the President, under the provisions of AR 800-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, and under authority contained in Circular No 32, Headquarters European Theater of Operations, United States Army, 20 March 1944, as amended, the Bronze Star Medal is awarded to:


