LEWIS, 36155193, M Sgt., Corps of Engineers, 672nd Engr Topc Co., who while serving with the Army of the United States distinguished himself by meritorious service during the period 27 Feb 45 to 15 Apr 45 in Germany, in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States. Entered military service from Michigan.

ALVIN M. BELL, 34525693, Sgt., Corps of Engineers, 672nd Engr Topc Co., who while serving with the Army of the United States distinguished himself by meritorious achievement on 12 Mar 45 in Germany, in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States. Entered military service from Tennessee.

ROSS E. THOMPSON, 34593250, Cpl., Corps of Engineers, 672nd Engr Topc Co., who while serving with the Army of the United States distinguished himself by meritorious service during the period 27 Feb 45 to 15 Apr 45 in Germany, in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States. Entered military service from North Carolina.

PAUL GOODMAN, 32180574, Tec 5, Medical Department, Med Det Headquarters Company XII Corps, who while serving with the Army of the United States distinguished himself by meritorious service during the period 1 Aug 44 to 30 Apr 45 in France, Luxembourg, and Germany, in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States. Entered military service from New York.

RAYMOND J. ALLOWAY, 37506196, PFC, Corps of Engineers, 672nd Engr Topc Co., who while serving with the Army of the United States distinguished himself by meritorious service during the period 27 Feb 45 to 15 Apr 45 in Germany, in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States. Entered military service from Kansas.

ELZIE A. FARMER, 37342219, PFC, Corps of Engineers, 672nd Engr Topc Co., who while serving with the Army of the United States distinguished himself by heroism on 20 Mar 45 and 7 Apr 45 in Germany. On 20 Mar 45, PFC Elzie A. Farmer, serving as front rodman for the Survey Platoon of the 672nd Engr Topographic Co, braved intense fire which enabled the survey crew to complete its mission. Again on 7 Apr 45, PFC Elzie A. Farmer, serving as front rodman for the Survey Platoon of the 672nd Engr Topographic Co, braved intense fire near Winkhausen, Germany, which enabled the survey party to complete its mission and thus get control for our artillery. His heroic achievement, in complete disregard for his own safety, and his devotion to duty reflect the highest credit on himself and the military service. Entered military service from Colorado.
