I --- SILVER STAR. Pursuant to authority contained in AR 600-45, dated 22 September 1943, as amended, and Memorandum 21, Headquarters Fifteenth United States Army, 4 March 1945, a Silver Star is awarded to the following:

Staff Sergeant Monroe H Bayless, 34526829, Infantry, United States Army, for gallantry in action in the vicinity of * * * , Luxembourg on 28 December 1944. Sergeant Bayless, a squad leader, went forward under heavy enemy shellfire to administer first aid to a seriously wounded comrade. While so engaged he saw an enemy mortar observer and shot and killed him. Sergeant Bayless then carried the wounded man to an aid station. His gallant actions are in accord with military tradition. Entered military service from Tennessee.

Sergeant Theodore R Holmes, 37260443, Infantry, United States Army, for gallantry in action near * * * , Germany on 30 March 1945. When his company, riding tanks into a village, was fired upon by an enemy machine gun placed between two buildings, Sergeant Holmes located the enemy weapon, mounted his tank's turret and while enemy bullets whistled about him, he manned the tank's machine gun and killed the enemy machine gunner. The remainder of the enemy crew fled into an adjoining building, but Sergeant Holmes pursued them. Wounding two in a fire fight within the building, he took all prisoners. Sergeant Holmes' courage, grim tenacity and disregard for personal safety are in accord with high military tradition. Entered military service from Nebraska.

Private First Class Walter J Stempniak, 36902963, Infantry, United States Army, for gallantry in action in the vicinity of * * * , France on 8 November 1944. When his squad was pinned to position by cross-fire of enemy machine guns, Private Stempniak, a rifleman, made his way forward to a position within fifty yards of one of the enemy emplacements, charged with a fixed bayonet, killed one of the German gunners and captured another. He then turned the enemy gun on the other German emplacement, neutralizing it and enabling his unit to resume its advance. Private Stempniak's intrepidity and fighting spirit have earned for him a place of honor in the annals of fighting infantrymen. Entered military service from Illinois.

II --- BRONZE STAR MEDAL. Pursuant to authority contained in AR 600-45, dated 22 September 1943, as amended, and Memorandum 21, Headquarters Fifteenth United States Army, 4 March 1945, a Bronze Star Medal is awarded to the following:

Captain Walter S Gunnarson, 0278309, Field Artillery, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Luxembourg, Belgium, Holland and Germany from 7 July 1944 to 27 April 1945. Entered military service from New York.

Captain Seth S King, 0449224, Field Artillery, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Belgium, Luxembourg, Holland and Germany from 11 July 1944 to 6 March 1945. Entered military service from Oklahoma.

Captain Kenneth F Trossen, 0420998, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Belgium, Luxembourg, Holland and Germany from 9 July 1944 to 5 May 1945. Entered military service from Illinois.

First Lieutenant William Beesley, 01300914, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Germany, Holland, Luxembourg and Belgium from 11 July 1944 to 9 May 1945. Entered military service from Missouri.

While serving as a mortar observer, Lieutenant Eshleman entered the town of * * * under heavy fire, administered first aid to a companion wounded by shell fragments, carried him to a place of safety, then returned through the continuing fire and accompanied a rifle unit advancing against the enemy. He effectively adjusted mortar fire upon the enemy, thereby contributing to the success of the troops in seizing and holding an important objective. Lieutenant Eshleman's outstanding performance under fire is in accord with high military tradition. Entered military service from Nebraska.

First Lieutenant Charles F Fischer, 01326830, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in Germany from 11 February to 9 May 1945. Entered military service from New Jersey.

First Lieutenant Gilbert L Gaumer, 0340524, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Belgium, Luxembourg, Holland and Germany from 26 November 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Kansas.

Second Lieutenant Clyde J Hudson, 02016467, Field Artillery, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Luxembourg, Belgium, Holland and Germany from 15 December 1944 to 4 May 1945. Entered military service from Louisiana.

Second Lieutenant John J McCarthy, 0538986, Infantry, United States Army, for heroic service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States near * * *, * * * and * * *, Germany on 2 March 1945. enemy emplacement so that the enemy was unable to return any observed fire. Sergeant Chrysler's courageous and inspiring actions enabled his unit to advance and rout the enemy forces from the area. Entered military service from New York.

Staff Sergeant Callis Crutchfield, 14063997, Infantry, United States Army, for heroic service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States near * * * , Germany on 3 March 1945. Sergeant Crutchfield, a mortar observer, established his observation post in an old tower ahead of the front lines and accurately adjusted fire upon enemy positions, despite the fact that his position was subjected to enemy fire. His accurate fire direction was an important factor in breaking-up a counterattack launched by the enemy, and facilitated the seizure of the objective by attacking riflemen. Entered military service from Tennessee.

Staff Sergeant Clarence J Durham, 20726772, Medical Department, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Luxembourg, Belgium, Holland and Germany from 11 July 1944 to 3 May 1945. Entered military service from Kansas.

Staff Sergeant William P Gilman, 31400966, Infantry, United States Army, for heroic service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States near * * * , Germany on 28 March 1945. Sergeant Gilman, a section leader, led his machine gun section into exposed positions affording maximum fire power, and delivered accurate fire into enemy emplacements which had halted the advance of a rifle platoon. This action enabled the riflemen to advance, as the enemy concentrated its fire upon Sergeant Gilman's unit. Sergeant Gilman was seriously wounded by shell fragments as he moved among his men, shouting words of encouragement and directing the fire of his guns. His courageous actions and selfless devotion to duty are in accord with military tradition. Entered military service from Maine.

Staff Sergeant Charles T Indivino, 32585709, Infantry, United States Army, for heroic service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States near * * * , Germany on 28 March 1945. When the infantry unit which his section was supporting became disorganized and withdrew to other positions during the course of a sharp enemy counterattack, Sergeant Indivino remained at his forward position and directed such an accurate concentration of mortar fire that the counterattack was repulsed and many of the enemy killed or wounded. His heroic action enabled the riflemen to continue the attack, during the course of which they captured 32 Germans. Sergeant Indivino's coolness, courage and accurate fire direction are in accord with military tradition. Entered military service from New York.

Staff Sergeant John L Keegan, 36030549, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Luxembourg, Belgium, Holland and Germany from 11 July 1944 to 30 April 1945. Entered military service from Illinois.

Staff Sergeant Louis Monari, 36035190, Infantry, United States Army, for heroic service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States near * * * , France on 28 September 1944. Sergeant Monari, a mortar observer, entered the town of * * * under enemy fire, established an observation post in a two-story building and directed accurate mortar fire upon enemy positions. Although this building received several direct hits from enemy shells, Sergeant Monari remained at his post. His outstanding performance of duty played an important part in breaking-up an enemy counterattack later that day. His courage and zeal for the success of his mission are in accord with military tradition. Entered military service from Illinois.

Staff Sergeant Harold D Robert, 34076368, Field Artillery, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Luxembourg, Belgium, Holland and Germany from 8 November 1944 to 30 April 1945. Entered military service from Louisiana.
