GENERAL ORDERS
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17 June 1945

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I -- SILVER STAR. Pursuant to authority contained in AR 600-45, dated 22 September 1943, as amended, and Memorandum 21, Headquarters Fifteenth United States Army, 4 March 1945, a Silver Star is awarded to the following:

Captain John M Roberts, 0363070, Infantry, United States Army, for gallantry in action in * * *, France on 8 and 9 November 1944. When his company's attack across open terrain was halted temporarily by withering enemy fire, Captain Roberts moved out ahead of his men and by his personal bravery and disregard for personal safety inspired them to resume the attack. Although forced to withdraw later, Captain Roberts led his men across the same ground on the following day, routed the Germans from their well dug-in positions, and pushed forward approximately five hundred yards. Captain Roberts' gallant actions, keen tactical knowledge and inspiring leadership honor his character as an officer. Entered military service from Nebraska.

First Lieutenant Robert D McDowell, 01535675, Chemical Warfare Service, United States Army, for gallantry in action at * * *, Germany on 8 March 1945. When his unit supported infantry elements, Lieutenant McDowell and other personnel occupied a strategically located house from which the enemy had but recently been driven. The enemy then concentrated an artillery barrage upon the site, whereupon Lieutenant McDowell directed other personnel to the cellar while himself remaining on the third floor to direct accurate fire which served to cause a cessation of the enemy fire. Lieutenant McDowell's tenacity of purpose in remaining at his hazardous position, his devotion to duty and utter disregard for personal safety, bespeak such gallantry in action as to be in accord with high military tradition. Entered military service from Pennsylvania.

First Lieutenant Ralph R Wance, 01037353, Chemical Warfare Service, United States Army, for gallantry in action at * * *, Germany on 6 March 1945. Lieutenant Wance was directing the fire of his unit in support of an infantry company when the enemy commenced an intense barrage. Disregarding personal safety, he left his position and exposed himself to the enemy artillery fire in order to direct more accurately the fire of his mortars. While so engaged, an enemy shell fragment smashed his wrist watch, but Lieutenant Wance gallantly remained exposed to the enemy fire and continued to direct his weapons. His actions are in accord with high military tradition and denote him an asset to the military service. Entered military service from Pennsylvania.

II -- BRONZE STAR MEDAL. Pursuant to authority contained in AR 600-45, dated 22 September 1943, as amended, and Memorandum 21, Headquarters Fifteenth United States Army, 4 March 1945, a Bronze Star Medal is awarded to the following:

Captain John L Fulmer, 0304517, Field Artillery, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Luxembourg, Holland and Germany from 11 July 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from South Carolina.

Captain Percy W Griffin, 0470069, Medical Corps, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in Holland and Germany from 31 December 1944 to 1 May 1945. Entered military service from Pennsylvania.

Captain Robert L Grogg, 01017224, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in Belgium, Holland and Germany from 31 December 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from California.

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Captain Stanley K Gutelius, O491266, Medical Corps, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Luxembourg, Belgium, Holland and Germany from 10 July 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from New York.

Captain Earl F Parsons, O360684, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Belgium, Luxembourg, Holland and Germany from 25 July 1944 to 1 May 1945. Entered military service from Kansas.

Captain Paul W Schwedler Jr, O1166599, Field Artillery, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Belgium, Luxembourg, Holland and Germany from 19 November 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Texas.

Captain John W Thompson Jr, O340705, Field Artillery, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Luxembourg, Belgium, Holland and Germany from 7 July 1944 to 27 April 1945. Entered military service from Maryland.

Captain Clifton A Wright, O1303586, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Belgium, Luxembourg, Holland and Germany from 20 July 1944 to 27 April 1945. Entered military service from Indiana.

First Lieutenant Robert R Batt, O1179354, Field Artillery, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Luxembourg, Belgium, Holland and Germany from 7 July 1944 to 27 April 1945. Entered military service from Washington, DC.

First Lieutenant David E Crawford, O1019030, Infantry, United States Army, for heroic service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States near * * *, Germany on 20 March 1945. When his platoon was subjected to heavy enemy fire from four well-defended antiaircraft guns, Lieutenant Crawford, a platoon leader, led his platoon in an attack on the guns, destroying one before being forced to withdraw for ammunition. After making a reconnaissance on foot, he again led an attack against the gun emplacement, capturing the remaining guns and 122 prisoners. Lieutenant Crawford's courageous initiative, keen tactical knowledge and daring leadership reflect credit upon his character as an officer. Entered military service from California.

First Lieutenant William B Crow, O517556, Field Artillery, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Luxembourg, Belgium, Holland and Germany from 11 July 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Florida.

First Lieutenant Earl C Frebe, O1181252, Field Artillery, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Luxembourg, Belgium, Holland and Germany from 1 July 1944 to 3 May 1945. Entered military service from Rhode Island.

First Lieutenant Cassius M Lea, O1047632, Coast Artillery Corps, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Luxembourg, Holland, Belgium and Germany from 1 November 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Michigan.

First Lieutenant Leonard H Sabourin, O1045906, Coast Artillery Corps, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Luxembourg, Belgium, Holland and Germany from 30 June 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Minnesota.

First Lieutenant Charles S Sancic, O1319660, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in Germany from 19 January to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Nevada.

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First Lieutenant Ted R Savage, 0557213 (then second lieutenant), Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in Holland and Germany from 11 February to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Oklahoma.

First Lieutenant Kleber M Trigg Jr, 0926225, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in Holland and Germany from 11 February to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Texas.

Master Sergeant Ferdinand G Brodfuehrer, 20738041, Medical Department, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Belgium, Luxembourg, Holland and Germany from 11 July 1944 to 24 April 1945. Entered military service from Nebraska.

Master Sergeant Henry Orbach, 32267929, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Germany, Holland, Luxembourg and Belgium from 11 July 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from New Jersey.

When his platoon was subjected to heavy enemy fire from four well-defended antiaircraft guns, Sergeant Burns, platoon sergeant, led a section of his platoon in an attack on the guns, destroying one before being forced to withdraw for ammunition. After making a reconnaissance on foot, he again led an attack against the gun emplacement, capturing the guns and 122 prisoners. Sergeant Burns' courageous actions and exemplary leadership reflect credit upon his character as a soldier. Entered military service from Alabama.

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Technical Sergeant William N Carraway, 34854820 (then staff sergeant), Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Belgium, Luxembourg, Holland and Germany from 22 September 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from North Carolina.

Sergeant Estes' courageous performance at great risk to personal safety saved a wounded comrade's life. His heroic actions are in accord with military tradition. Entered military service from Missouri.

Staff Sergeant Peter Hoolsma, 36158435, Infantry, United States Army, for heroic service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in the * * * , France on 30 September 1944. When a member of his squad was wounded and fell in an exposed position, Sergeant Hoolsma left the protection of his foxhole, ran to the side of the wounded man and remained with him for two hours, trying to stop profuse bleeding and rendering all aid possible, while heavy concentrations of enemy shellfire continued to fall in the area. Sergeant Hoolsma's courageous performance at great risk to personal safety saved a wounded comrade's life. His heroic actions are in accord with military tradition. Entered military service from Missouri.
