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I -- SILVER STAR. Pursuant to authority contained in AR 600-45, dated 22 September 1945, as amended, and Memorandum 21, Headquarters Fifteenth United States Army, 4 March 1945, a Silver Star is awarded, posthumously, to the following:

Private First Class John J Carniglia, 32780423, Infantry, United States Army, for gallantry in action in the vicinity of \* \* \* , France, on 1 August 1944. During a particularly heavy enemy artillery and mortar barrage which necessitated a limited withdrawal by his unit, Private Carniglia, a machine gunner, went forward to aid a wounded soldier. While so engaged, he was seriously wounded, but continued to treat the wounds of his comrade-in-arms. Rather than hinder the withdrawal of his unit by having help sent to him, Private Carniglia signaled his leader to continue the withdrawal and leave him behind. His heroic actions in subordinating all thought of personal welfare reflect credit upon his character as a soldier and are in accord with the traditions of the military service. Entered military service from New York.

II -- SILVER STAR. Pursuant to authority contained in AR 600-45, dated 22 September 1945, as amended, and Memorandum 21, Headquarters Fifteenth United States Army, 4 March 1945, a Silver Star is awarded to the following:

Staff Sergeant Denzil L Lindbon, 36960815, Infantry, United States Army, for gallantry in action near \* \* \* , Germany, on 12 April 1945. When he and two comrades were isolated on the hostile shore of the \* \* \* River after crossing into enemy territory, engaging in several fire fights with the enemy, and capturing a prisoner, Sergeant Lindbon jumped into the icy water, swam across the river under machine gun fire, secured a boat and rowed across the river, then returned with two comrades and the German prisoner. His intrepid actions during a most hazardous mission reflect high credit upon Sergeant Lindbon's character and training as a soldier. Entered military service from Illinois.

Sergeant David J Greene, 34812636, Infantry, United States Army, for gallantry in action in the vicinity of \* \* \* , France on 19 November 1944. When his unit, which was attached to a rifle company, was pinned to position by heavy enemy fire, and one of the machine guns jammed and left only one heavy machine gun in action against the enemy, Sergeant Greene, a squad leader, cradled his weapon in his arms and advanced against the enemy up a steep hill. He so skillfully directed his fire against the Germans that he neutralized two machine gun nests and inflicted many casualties among the German troops. He was later wounded but refused evacuation until the mission had been completed. Sergeant Greene's courage, bravery and gallant actions reflect credit upon his character and training as a soldier. Entered military service from Alabama.

Sergeant Billie L Petrie, 35777913, Infantry, United States Army, for gallantry in action near \* \* \* , Germany on 27 March 1945. Sergeant Petrie, a squad leader, placed another man in charge of the squad while he went forward in an attempt to destroy an enemy machine gun position. After a fire fight with the enemy, he returned for additional ammunition, went forward again, and after a hand grenade battle, accounted for five enemy dead and the capture of twelve prisoners. Sergeant Petrie's aggressive leadership, his fighting spirit and courage constitute the gallantry that symbolizes American military tradition. Entered military service from Ohio.

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Technician Fourth Grade Harold L Oehlerking, 36617128, Medical Department, United States Army, for gallantry in action in the vicinity of \* \* \* , Belgium on 10 January 1945. Although cognizant of the fact that the enemy troops were disregarding the medical insignia during the bitter fighting raging in this area, Sergeant Oehlerking, an aid man, made his way forward through a field swept by machine gun fire, and administered first aid to two soldiers lying in an exposed position. He then carried them to a point from which they could be evacuated for further treatment. Sergeant Oehlerking's gallant actions are in accord with military tradition. Entered military service from Illinois.

III -- BRONZE STAR MEDAL. Pursuant to authority contained in AR 600-45, dated 22 September 1945, as amended, and Memorandum 21, Headquarters Fifteenth United Army, 4 March 1945, a Bronze Star Medal is awarded to the following:

Captain George R Ambold, 01174489 (then first lieutenant), Field Artillery, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Luxembourg, Belgium, Holland and Germany from 7 July 1944 to 24 April 1945. Entered military service from Colorado.

Captain Louis W Brown Jr, 0391055, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Belgium, Holland, Luxembourg and Germany from 11 July 1944 to 30 April 1945. Entered military service from Texas.

Captain Kenneth L Leiby, 01595317, Quartermaster Corps, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in Germany from 1 April to 6 May 1945. Entered military service from Pennsylvania.

Captain John M Roberts, 0363070, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in Holland and Germany from 20 March to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Nebraska.

First Lieutenant Jack L Bush, 01321487, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Luxembourg, Belgium, Holland and Germany from 21 September 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Indiana.

First Lieutenant Elbert Cannack, 01306811, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Luxembourg and Germany from 9 July 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Iowa.

First Lieutenant Franklin E Chaffee, 01328227 (then second lieutenant), Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Holland and Germany from 22 January to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from California.

First Lieutenant Ben W Crume Jr, 01295680, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Luxembourg, Belgium, Holland and Germany from 7 December 1944 to 30 April 1945. Entered military service from Kentucky.

First Lieutenant Grady L Hicks, 0515610, Field Artillery, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in Holland and Germany from 14 February to 2 May 1945. Entered military service from Missouri.

First Lieutenant John F Kearney Jr, 0540054 (then second lieutenant), Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in Germany from 20 February to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from California.

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First Lieutenant Arthur F LaFond, 01822589, Field Artillery, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Belgium, Luxembourg, Holland and Germany from 17 July 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Connecticut.

First Lieutenant Charles S McLean, 01313277, Infantry, United States Army, for heroic service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in the vicinity of \* \* \* , France on 8 November 1944. When his forward observation post was subjected to accurate enemy shellfire which scored several direct hits and wounded his assistant, Lieutenant McLean calmly and courageously administered first aid to the wounded man, then continued to adjust mortar fire against enemy positions with such accuracy that one enemy self-propelled gun was destroyed and others forced to be withdrawn. His courageous actions reflect credit upon his character as an officer. Entered military service from Connecticut.

First Lieutenant John O Feustadt, 01018963, Infantry, United States Army, for heroic service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in the vicinity of \* \* \* , Holland on 2 March 1945. When the tank ahead of him was disabled and set afire by enemy rocket projectiles and two crew members seriously wounded, Lieutenant Feustadt, under heavy enemy fire, left the comparative safety of his tank, ran to the burning vehicle and evacuated the wounded men to an antitank ditch. Lieutenant Feustadt then led his tanks on to their objective. Lieutenant Feustadt's courageous actions and exemplary leadership honor his character as an officer. Entered military service from Maryland.

First Lieutenant Paul L Powell, 01999954 (then second lieutenant), Medical Administrative Corps, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Germany, Luxembourg, Belgium and Holland from 11 July 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Kansas.

First Lieutenant Mack G Reed, 01058361, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in Holland and Germany from 11 February to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Texas.

First Lieutenant Jerry P Richardson, 01328403 (then second lieutenant), Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in Holland and Germany from 11 February to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Arkansas.

First Lieutenant Orenith S Smith, 01547801, Medical Administrative Corps, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Belgium, Luxembourg, Holland and Germany from 11 July 1944 to 24 April 1945. Entered military service from Kansas.

First Lieutenant John F Scully, 01054403, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in Holland and Germany from 11 February to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from New York.

Chief Warrant Officer William R Johnston, W2111960, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Luxembourg, Belgium, Holland and Germany from 11 July 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Missouri.

Master Sergeant Lewis E Bryan, 20723917, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Germany, Holland, Luxembourg and Belgium from 11 July 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Kansas.

First Sergeant James F Hunter, 36317406, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Germany, Luxembourg, Belgium and Holland from 11 July 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Illinois.

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First Sergeant Francis E Mahan, 37070680, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Belgium, Luxembourg, Holland and Germany from 11 July 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Kansas.

First Sergeant Joseph F Prendergast, 12094040, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Germany, Belgium, Luxembourg and Holland from 1 October 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from New Jersey.

First Sergeant Dean H Walters, 36030624, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Luxembourg, Belgium, Holland and Germany from 9 July 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Iowa.

Technical Sergeant Everett Baird, 34504594, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Luxembourg, Belgium, Holland and Germany from 9 July 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Tennessee.

Technical Sergeant Stanley A Burda, 37582910, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Luxembourg, Holland and Germany from 22 September 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Minnesota.

Technical Sergeant Pasquale Elia, 33807624, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Luxembourg, Belgium, Holland and Germany from 22 September 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Pennsylvania.

Technical Sergeant Thomas J Hogan, 20724761 (then private first class), Infantry, United States Army, for heroic service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in the vicinity of \* \* \* , Belgium on 11 January 1945. During the course of bitter fighting, when his unit suffered heavy casualties, Sergeant Hogan, an acting squad leader, assumed command of the remnants of two platoons, reorganized them under fire, and led an attack which resulted in the seizure of an important objective. Sergeant Hogan's courage, initiative and demonstrated leadership ability honor his character as a soldier. Entered military service from Kansas.

Technical Sergeant Edward M Massof, 33418812, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Luxembourg, Holland and Germany from 21 July 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Pennsylvania.

Technical Sergeant George E McCann, 20723947, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Belgium, Luxembourg, Holland and Germany from 11 July 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Kansas.

Technical Sergeant John Meier, 37001807, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Germany, Luxembourg, Belgium and Holland from 11 July 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Kansas.

Technical Sergeant Virgil W Pierce, 20724264, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Belgium, Luxembourg, Holland and Germany from 11 July 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Kansas.

Technical Sergeant Thomas L Wells, 38447245, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Luxembourg, Belgium, Holland and Germany from 9 July 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Arkansas.

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Staff Sergeant Louis R Ardolino, 32780524, Infantry, United States Army, for heroic service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States near \* \* \* , France on 17 September 1944. As Sergeant Ardolino, with a group of twelve men, reached an advanced position, two enemy tanks supported by two infantry companies launched a counterattack. Greatly outnumbered, the American group held its ground, Sergeant Ardolino then directed his squad in thwarting an enemy break-through. The courage, tenacity of purpose and disregard for personal safety displayed by Sergeant Ardolino reflect credit upon his character as a soldier. Entered military service from New York.

Staff Sergeant Leonard H Buller, 37070552, Infantry, United States Army, for heroic service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States near \* \* \* , Germany on 23 April 1945. At the \* \* \* River, an enemy patrol encountered an American combat patrol of which Sergeant Buller was a member. In the ensuing fire fight, when his patrol was pinned down by the enemy action, Sergeant Buller moved to the enemy flank, opened fire upon them, forced the withdrawal of the enemy patrol, and enabled his comrades to continue on their mission. His initiative, resourcefulness and courage are in accord with military tradition, and reflect credit upon Sergeant Buller's character as a soldier. Entered military service from Kansas.

Staff Sergeant Frank J Cochran, 39719761, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Luxembourg, Belgium, Holland and Germany from 6 September 1944 to 30 April 1945. Entered military service from California.

Staff Sergeant Robert I Horvath, 42010909, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Holland and Germany from 11 July to 26 September 1944, and from 22 January to 30 April 1945. Entered military service from New Jersey.

Staff Sergeant William B Howard Jr, 34589978, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Luxembourg, Belgium, Holland and Germany from 9 July 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Alabama.

Staff Sergeant Wallace E Irey, 39533801, Field Artillery, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Belgium, Luxembourg, Holland and Germany from 11 July 1944 to 2 May 1945. Entered military service from California.

Staff Sergeant Robert M Marshall, 13132939, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Belgium, Luxembourg, Holland and Germany from 20 December 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Pennsylvania.

Staff Sergeant Jesus M Mejia, 38426983, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Luxembourg, Belgium, Holland and Germany from 20 December 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Texas.

Staff Sergeant Stanley W Mendiagral, 36174673, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Luxembourg, Belgium, Holland and Germany from 1 October 1944 to 30 April 1945. Entered military service from Michigan.

Staff Sergeant Wayne W Moreton, 38446925, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Belgium, Luxembourg, Holland and Germany from 15 November 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Arkansas.

Staff Sergeant Dale Rankin, 36030129, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Belgium, Luxembourg, Holland and Germany from 9 July 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Illinois.

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Staff Sergeant Eugene N Rausch, 37070937, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Germany, Belgium, Luxembourg and Holland from 11 July 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Kansas.

Staff Sergeant James L Semones, 33655507, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Luxembourg, Belgium, Holland and Germany from 15 July 1944 to 30 April 1945. Entered military service from Virginia.

Staff Sergeant James J Sommerville, 36560871, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Luxembourg, Belgium, Holland and Germany from 9 July 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Michigan.

Sergeant George H Barclay, 38536605, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Belgium, Luxembourg, Holland and Germany from 19 July 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Texas.

Sergeant Earnel H Lusk, 35207666, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Belgium, Luxembourg, Holland and Germany from 11 July 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from West Virginia.

Sergeant Raymond Oneha, 20011237, Field Artillery, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Luxembourg, Belgium, Holland and Germany from 7 July 1944 to 27 April 1945. Entered military service from Territory of Hawaii.

Sergeant Ernest J Oyos, 19165255, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Belgium, Luxembourg, Holland and Germany from 19 August 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from California.

Corporal Earl J Brown, 37709436, Field Artillery, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in Belgium, Holland, France and Germany from 9 January to 27 April 1945. Entered military service from Colorado.

Corporal William H Phillips, 38072119, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Germany, Holland, Luxembourg and Belgium from 11 July 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Texas.

Technician Fifth Grade Hans Gehlsen, 39827248, Quartermaster Corps, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Belgium, Luxembourg, Holland and Germany from 25 July 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Idaho.

Technician Fifth Grade Admiral D Gross, 37143630, Infantry, United States Army, for heroic service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in the \* \* \* , France on 2 October 1944. When his truck, laden with ammunition and supplies, was struck by enemy mortar fire, Corporal Gross, disregarding personal safety, ran to the vehicle, unloaded twenty gallons of gasoline, and removed a shovel with which he threw dirt upon and extinguished the blaze. The actions of Corporal Gross, accomplished under enemy fire, reflect credit upon his character and military training. Entered military service from Kansas.

Technician Fifth Grade Leo A Look, 36862195, Medical Department, United States Army, for heroic service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in the \* \* \* , France on 30 September 1944. When a member of the platoon to which he was attached was wounded and fell in an exposed

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position, Corporal Look, an aid man, left the comparative safety of his fox-hole, ran to the side of the wounded soldier and administered first aid. He remained with him for two hours while intense enemy shellfire continued to fall in the area. Corporal Look's courage, disregard for personal safety, and prompt, efficient treatment of the seriously wounded man undoubtedly saved that soldier's life. Entered military service from Michigan.

Private First Class Raymond Bunch, 35682311, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Belgium, Luxembourg, Holland and Germany from 17 July 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Kentucky.

Private First Class Robert A Carter, 37623053, Medical Department, United States Army, for heroic service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in the vicinity of \* \* \* , Belgium on 28 December 1944. When two of his comrades were wounded and trapped beyond the front lines of the company, Private Carter, a medical aid man, fearlessly went forward in the face of the heavy enemy fire and treated their wounds. He then dragged each man back to a point from which they were evacuated to the battalion aid station. Private Carter's courageous initiative, coolness under fire, and heroic actions reflect credit upon his character as a soldier. Entered military service from Missouri.

Private First Class Milton J Fowler, 36121433, Infantry, United States Army, for heroic service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in the \* \* \* , France on 30 September 1944. During a period of intense enemy shelling, Private Fowler's ammunition-laden truck was struck by an enemy shell. The vehicle was set ablaze. Private Fowler quickly left his fox-hole and, amid enemy fire, resourcefully extinguished the blaze, thus preventing injury to nearby personnel and damage to the vehicle. Private Fowler's prompt action, his initiative and disregard for personal safety reflect credit upon his character as a soldier. Entered military service from Michigan.

Private First Class C G King, 6966390, Field Artillery, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Belgium, Luxembourg, Holland and Germany from 7 July 1944 to 27 April 1945. Entered military service from Alabama.

Private First Class Wilford C Mitchell, 15086841, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Belgium, Luxembourg, Holland and Germany from 9 July 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Kentucky.

Private First Class Clyde A Olmstead Jr, 35843458, Infantry, United States Army, for heroic service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States near \* \* \* , Germany on 30 March 1945. While on outpost duty, Private Olmstead, a machine gunner, was attacked by an enemy group approaching his position. Although outnumbered, he manned his weapon to repel the enemy attack, remaining at his position until the enemy withdrew. Private Olmstead's courage, tenacity of purpose and devotion to duty reflect credit upon his character as a soldier. Entered military service from Indiana.

Private First Class Delbert M Rakes, 37137991, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Luxembourg, Belgium, Holland and Germany from 9 July 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Missouri.

Private First Class Edwin W Ramsey, 33784040, Medical Department, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Belgium, Luxembourg, Holland and Germany from 11 July 1944 to 24 April 1945. Entered military service from Pennsylvania.

Private First Class Francis N Renner, 36960252, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Belgium, Luxembourg, Holland and Germany from 1 October 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Michigan.

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Private First Class John C Sather, 39195950, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Luxembourg, Belgium, Holland and Germany from 30 July 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Washington.

Private First Class Roy J Smetak, 37568765, Medical Department, United States Army, for heroic service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in \* \* \* , Germany on 18 February 1945. When three men were wounded during an enemy artillery barrage, Private Smetak, a medical aid man, left the comparative safety of his billet and, despite the fact that the barrage was increasing in intensity, calmly rendered first aid to the wounded men. He supervised the evacuation of two of the men and then ran two blocks through shell fire to obtain a litter to evacuate the third man who was too seriously wounded to otherwise be moved. Private Smetak's courageous actions and zealous devotion to duty reflect credit upon his character as a soldier. Entered military service from Minnesota.

IV -- PURPLE HEART. Pursuant to authority contained in AR 600-45, dated 22 September 1943, as amended, and Memorandum 21, Headquarters Fifteenth United States Army, 4 March 1945, a Purple Heart is awarded to the following for wounds received in action against the enemy in country shown on dates indicated:
