I -- SILVER STAR. Pursuant to authority contained in AR 600-45, dated 22 September 1943, as amended, and Memorandum 21, Headquarters Fifteenth United States Army, 4 March 1945, a Silver Star is awarded, posthumously, to the following:

Staff Sergeant Monroe H Bayless, 34526829, Infantry, United States Army, for gallantry in action in the vicinity of * * *, Luxembourg on 28 December 1944. Sergeant Bayless, a squad leader, went forward under heavy enemy shellfire to administer first aid to a seriously wounded comrade. While so engaged he saw an enemy mortar observer and shot and killed him. Sergeant Bayless then carried the wounded man to an aid station. His gallant actions are in accord with military tradition. Entered military service from Tennessee.

II -- SILVER STAR. Pursuant to authority contained in AR 600-45, dated 22 September 1943, as amended, and Memorandum 21, Headquarters Fifteenth United States Army, 4 March 1945, a Silver Star is awarded to the following:

Colonel Douglas G Dwyre, 017535 (then lieutenant colonel), Field Artillery, United States Army, for gallantry in action near * * *, France on 22 August 1944. In preparation for the attack upon the enemy-held city of * * *, Colonel Dwyre, then a lieutenant colonel commanding the * * * Field Artillery Battalion, upon his own initiative, and fully aware of the personal risk involved, advanced alone into hostile territory in order to familiarize himself with the terrain so that his unit would most effectively support infantry elements in the impending attack. The effectiveness of artillery support during the actual attack attested the great value of Colonel Dwyre's personal reconnaissance and firm determination to place the mission at hand above personal interest and safety. Colonel Dwyre's gallant actions are in accord with high military tradition. Entered United States Military Academy from Nevada.

First Lieutenant Stanley H Casey, 0405884, Infantry, United States Army, for gallantry in action in the vicinity of * * *, Belgium on 30 December 1944. Refusing to give ground to a heavy enemy counterattack, Lieutenant Casey, commanding a rifle company, instituted a defense and through his inspirational leadership was able to check the enemy, thereby allowing adjoining units to organize and repel the enemy attack. During the course of this action, Lieutenant Casey personally manned a machine gun in support of his attacking troops, then went forward armed with a rocket launcher and scored a direct hit on an enemy vehicle. His resourcefulness, intrepidity and disregard for personal safety honor Lieutenant Casey's character as an officer and leader of men. Entered military service from Arkansas.

First Lieutenant Merrill H Lyon, 01324105 (then second lieutenant), Infantry, United States Army, for gallantry in action at * * *, France on 23 November 1944. During an attack on enemy-held positions, Lieutenant Lyon maneuvered his men through intense enemy fire to attain their objective, after which he reorganized part of another unit which had been pinned down and led it to a new position from which it repulsed an enemy armored attack. Lieutenant Lyon's leadership, initiative and devotion to duty denote him an asset to the military service. Entered military service from Kansas.

First Lieutenant Norman F Wardwell, 01323078 (then second lieutenant), Infantry, United States Army, for gallantry in action near * * *, Normandy, France on 17 July 1944. After completing his mission of establishing contact with an adjoining unit, Lieutenant Wardwell, a platoon leader, returned to his company and found it in a state of confusion, its commander wounded, and concentrations of enemy fire falling in the area. Promptly assuming command and reorganizing his troops, Lieutenant Wardwell led the company in an inspiring advance over difficult terrain interspersed with hedgerows and sunken roads, forcing an enemy withdrawal and capturing a number of prisoners. While leading the attack, Lieutenant Wardwell came upon an enemy mortar, personally destroyed it with grenades, and killed a member of the crew who attempted to escape. Lieutenant Wardwell's intrepidity reflects the highest credit upon his character as an officer and leader of men. Entered military service from Connecticut.

Technical Sergeant Michael J Pagliaro, 36034543, Infantry, United States Army, for gallantry in action near * * *, France on 9 and 10 December 1944. Sergeant Pagliaro, a platoon sergeant, with sixteen men left in his platoon, led the first unit in his battalion to take its objective in Germany. He led his platoon, depleted by casualties, in an assault crossing of the * * * River, then stormed a hill position, knocking out three enemy machine guns and capturing eighteen Germans. His gallant actions and outstanding performance of difficult missions reflect credit upon his character as a soldier. Entered military service from Illinois.

Staff Sergeant Herman Brack, 20720606, Infantry, United States Army, for gallantry in action near * * *, France on 23 November 1944. During an attack against enemy positions, Sergeant Brack was wounded, and although he lost a great deal of blood and suffered great pain, he refused evacuation and continued in action to neutralize one enemy machine gun position. As his company consolidated its position he remained exposed to enemy fire to cover the movement. Sergeant Brack's fortitude, tenacity of purpose and extreme devotion to duty reflect credit upon his character as a soldier. Entered military service from Kansas.

Staff Sergeant Kenneth G Walther, 32726465, Infantry, United States Army, for gallantry in action at * * *, Germany on 16 April 1945. When an enemy force of battalion strength launched a counterattack against a newly-won bridgehead and succeeded in capturing his platoon leader, platoon sergeant, the members of a machine gun section and a depleted rifle platoon, Sergeant Walther, a machine gun section leader, quickly reorganized the remainder of his platoon, coordinated it with other friendly elements to form sound defensive positions and, despite his three wounds received in the action, remained to direct his men until ordered to the aid station by an officer. Sergeant Walther's gallant actions contributed materially to the successful repulse of the enemy and are in accord with military tradition. Entered military service from New York.

III -- SOLDIER'S MEDAL. Pursuant to authority contained in AR 600-45, dated 22 September 1943, as amended, and Memorandum 21, Headquarters Fifteenth United States Army, 4 March 1945, a Soldier's Medal is awarded to the following:

Captain Donald E Kennedy, 0303229, Field Artillery, United States Army, for heroism at * * *, Germany on 26 March 1945. When an enemy artillery shell struck and set ablaze a powder dump in his battery, Captain Kennedy immediately ran to his gun position and there found an enlisted man whose clothes were afire from the burning powder. Unhesitatingly, and with disregard for personal safety, Captain Kennedy braved the flames, pulled the soldier to safety and smothered the flames engulfing the enlisted man, by throwing dirt upon them. By his quick and courageous actions, Captain Kennedy saved a soldier of his command from further injury and possible death. Entered military service from Illinois.

Staff Sergeant James Lemaick, 39093828, Infantry, United States Army, for heroism near * * *, Germany on 24 May 1945. When a member of his squad accidentally fell from the end of a dock into the swift * * * River, the man unable to swim, was about to drown when Sergeant Lemaick unhesitatingly plunged into the racing current which by then was taking the drowning man downstream. With difficulty, Sergeant Lemaick brought the unconscious man to shore, where artificial respiration revived him. The courageous action of Sergeant Lemaick, at the risk of his own life to save that of a fellow-soldier, is in accord with military tradition. Entered military service from Oregon.

IV -- BRONZE STAR MEDAL. Pursuant to authority contained in AR 600-45, dated 22 September 1943, as amended, and Memorandum 21, Headquarters Fifteenth United States Army, 4 March 1945, a Bronze Star Medal is awarded, posthumously, to the following:

Staff Sergeant Paul Kozar, 32913764, Infantry, United States Army, for heroic service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in the vicinity of * * * , France on 17 November 1944. Sergeant Kozar, a squad leader, and another noncommissioned officer volunteered to reconnoiter the positions of enemy mortars and rifle emplacements. Sergeant Kozar and his companion advanced a distance of about 1600 yards into enemy territory, located the enemy emplacements and returned with the information which proved of primary importance in facilitating assault plans since the initial assault involved the crossing of open ground. The courageous action and resourcefulness of Sergeant Kozar reflect credit upon his character and training as a soldier. Entered military service from New Jersey.

V -- BRONZE STAR MEDAL. Pursuant to authority contained in AR 600-45, dated 22 September 1943, as amended, and Memorandum 21, Headquarters Fifteenth United States Army, 4 March 1945, a Bronze Star Medal is awarded to the following:

Captain James L Chitwood, 0513272, Medical Corps, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in Germany from 28 March to 6 May 1945. Entered military service from Virginia.

Chaplain (Captain) Albert J Klein, 0416778, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Luxembourg, Belgium, Holland and Germany from 29 September 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Ohio.

Captain Joseph L Vignes, 0395132, Infantry, United States Army for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France and Luxembourg from 9 July 1944 to 2 January 1945. Entered military service from Louisiana.

First Lieutenant James R Bollace, 01046721, Coast Artillery Corps, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Luxembourg, Holland, Belgium and Germany from 19 June 1944 to 2 May 1945. Entered military service from Pennsylvania.

First Lieutenant William H Ellis, 0467182, Field Artillery, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Luxembourg, Belgium and Germany from 27 November 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Missouri.

First Lieutenant Robert J Haley, 01323313, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Germany, Holland, Luxembourg and Belgium from 24 November 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Pennsylvania.

First Lieutenant James E Judson, 01180978, Field Artillery, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in Holland and Germany from 4 March to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from California.

First Lieutenant William W Moon, 01322463, Infantry, United States Army, for heroic service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in the vicinity of * * * , Germany on 16 April 1945. While engaged in making a personal reconnaissance for positions for his mortar platoon in order that there would be no delay in moving the mortars ahead when the rifle troops began to advance, Lieutenant Moon, exposing himself to enemy observation and direct fire, effectively directed mortar fire against a barge which had been serving the enemy as an ammunition dump, destroying the barge and eliminating a serious threat to the safety of our troops. Lieutenant Moon's courageous initiative, ability, and heroic actions reflect credit upon his character as an officer. Entered military service from Michigan.

First Lieutenant Jeremiah D O'Meara, 01165926, Field Artillery, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Belgium, Luxembourg, Holland and Germany from 8 November 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from New York.

First Lieutenant John E Patton, 01183387, Field Artillery, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Belgium, Luxembourg and Germany from 24 July 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Ohio.

First Lieutenant Arthur E Pontier, 01303775, Infantry, United States Army, for heroic service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States near * * *, France on 10 December 1944. Lieutenant Pontier, a mortar platoon leader, exposed himself to enemy fire in order to obtain better observation for the directing of his weapons. Disregarding personal safety, when the enemy pressed two counterattacks, Lieutenant Pontier called for mortar fire to within fifty to seventy-five yards of his own position in successfully repelling both enemy attempts. Lieutenant Pontier's courage, tactical skill and devotion to duty are in accord with military tradition. Entered military service from New Jersey.

First Lieutenant Vernon L Rottman, 01312986, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in Belgium and Germany from 20 January to 6 May 1945. Entered military service from Colorado.

First Lieutenant William C Shepard, 01283331, Infantry, United States Army, for heroic service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States near * * *, France on 5 December 1944. When the other two members of his patrol lost their footing in the darkness and fell into a canal from a partially damaged railroad bridge which they were reconnoitering as a possible location for a foot bridge across the * * * River, attracting the attention of the enemy who opened up with machine gun fire, Lieutenant Shepard, disregarding his personal safety, crawled to the edge of the bank and succeeded in pulling them out. Lieutenant Shepard's courage, intrepidity and heroic actions honor his character as an officer. Entered military service from New York.

First Lieutenant Howard P Yaple, 0887609 (then technical sergeant and second lieutenant), Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Germany, Holland, Luxembourg and Belgium from 11 July 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Kansas.

Second Lieutenant Karl K Baron, 01182505, Field Artillery, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Luxembourg, Belgium and Germany from 24 September 1944 to 20 April 1945. Entered military service from New Jersey.

Second Lieutenant Verland T Jahnke, 02012179, Field Artillery, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Luxembourg, Belgium, Holland and Germany from 10 July 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Kansas.

Second Lieutenant Thelford E Kolch, 02012144, Army of the United States, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Luxembourg, Belgium, Holland and Germany from 6 July 1944 to 1 May 1945. Entered military service from Illinois.

Chief Warrant Officer Clifford D Mullis, W2104776, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Belgium, Luxembourg, Holland and Germany from 9 July 1944 to 3 May 1945. Entered military service from Kansas.

First Sergeant Clifford T Davis, 20724483, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Germany, Luxembourg, Belgium and Holland from 11 July 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Kansas.

First Sergeant Henry J Patrick, 14023023, Field Artillery, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Belgium, Luxembourg, Holland and Germany from 11 July 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Louisiana.

Technical Sergeant Angelo J Lapera, 6139915, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Luxembourg, Belgium and Germany from 15 July 1944 to 3 May 1945. Entered military service from Massachusetts.

Technical Sergeant William R Martin, 20738008, Medical Department, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Belgium, Luxembourg, Holland and Germany from 7 July 1944 to 24 April 1945. Staff Sergeant Paul J Flening, 12056036, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Luxembourg, Belgium, Holland and Germany from 9 July 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from New York.

Technician Fifth Grade Earl J Emge, 35490469, Infantry, United States Army, for heroic service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States near * * * , Belgium on 2 January 1945. While on a reconnaissance, Corporal Emge found an aged Belgian woman lying in a road which was under fire from enemy mortars and artillery. He returned to his vehicle, and while driving toward the prostrate form, discovered an unmarked mine field between the wounded person and himself. He slowly maneuvered his vehicle through the danger area to the aged woman, gave her first aid, placed her in his vehicle and returned through the mine field, proceeding to the nearest aid station where the woman's life was saved. Corporal Emge's heroic actions honor his character as a soldier. Entered military service from Indiana.

Technician Fifth Grade Joe Ganje, 37250032, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Belgium, Luxembourg and Germany from 15 July 1944 to 30 April 1945. Entered military service from South Dakota.

Technician Fifth Grade Benjamin F Gillard, 37486449, Field Artillery, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Belgium, Luxembourg, Holland and Germany from 16 September 1944 to 27 April 1945. Entered military service from Nebraska.

Technician Fifth Grade John P Kelly Jr, 12054653, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Germany, Luxembourg and Belgium from 15 July 1944 to 30 April 1945. Entered military service from New York.

Private First Class David W Dahle, 39918351, Infantry, United States Army, for heroic service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in the vicinity of * * * , France on 6 October 1944. When the sergeant in charge of his outpost was killed by enemy fire and telephone communication severed by enemy artillery, Private Dahle, a member of a rocket launcher team, ran back through heavy enemy fire to the 60mm mortars to cause them to fire flares. While tracing the line to the break, he was captured and disarmed by an enemy officer and three enlisted men, but while being marched to the rear, succeeded in wresting a weapon from one of the enemy soldiers, covered them, and returned through heavy enemy and friendly fire to his own lines with his prisoners and former captors. Private Dahle's heroic actions reflect credit upon his character as a soldier. Entered military service from Utah.

Private First Class Francis J Fennessy, 12170087, Infantry, United States Army for heroic service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States near * * * , Germany on 26 February 1945. When his unit reached a bridge spanning the * * * River, it was discovered that the bridge had a tremendous demolition charge beneath it, whereupon Private Fennessy, a rifleman, volunteered to reach an engineer unit, which he successfully accomplished, although he was twice fired upon by enemy machine guns and pinned-down by enemy artillery while so engaged. He then led the engineer unit to the site, the demolition charge was removed and the infantry unit made its river crossing. Private Fennessy's courage, tenacity of purpose and devotion to duty reflect credit upon his character as a soldier. Entered military service from New York.

Private First Class William L Herbstreet, 33906265, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Holland and Germany from 22 January to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Maryland.

Private First Class Olen S Lockhart, 34505536, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Luxembourg, Belgium, Holland and Germany from 9 July 1944 to 30 April 1945. Entered military service from Tennessee.

Private First Class Elmer W Peacock, 39040613, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Luxembourg, Belgium, Holland and Germany from 9 July 1944 to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from California.

Private First Class Raymond Roar, 35773051, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Luxembourg, Belgium, Holland and Germany from 20 July 1944 to 1 May 1945. Entered military service from Kentucky.

Private First Class Thomas C Tucciarone, 32632801, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Luxembourg, Belgium and Germany from 15 July 1944 to 30 April 1945. Entered military service from New York.

Private First Class Nicholas F Turowicz, 32895349, Medical Department, United States Army, for heroic service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in the vicinity of * * * , Germany on 1 April 1945. When the platoon to which he was attached as surgical technician was pinned down by heavy enemy fire and a number of men wounded, Private Turowicz assumed the duties of company aid man, rendered first aid to fourteen men, and when the enemy barrage increased in intensity, protected a wounded soldier with his own body. He then went back to the aid station, led a litter party to the wounded men and back again to safety, where he continued to render further aid to the wounded men. Private Turowicz's courageous initiative, intrepidity and extreme devotion to duty honor his character as a soldier. Entered military service from New York.

Private Arnold Stanislaw, 33835238, Medical Department, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in Germany from 7 February to 26 March 1945. Entered military service from Pennsylvania.

VI --- BRONZE STAR MEDAL (OAK-LEAF CLUSTER). Pursuant to authority contained in AR 600-45, dated 22 September 1943, as amended, and Memorandum 21, Headquarters Fifteenth United States Army, 4 March 1945, in addition to the Bronze Star Medal previously awarded, a bronze Oak-Leaf Cluster is awarded to the following:

Captain Nathan H Hixson, 01040942, Coast Artillery Corps, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France, Luxembourg, Belgium, Holland and Germany from 1 January to 8 May 1945. Entered military service from Maryland.

First Lieutenant Richard G Betts, 0547272, Infantry, United States Army, for heroic service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States near * * * , Germany on 12 December 1944. Lieutenant Betts led his platoon in the initial wave to cross the * * * River, and on the German side, led his men in capturing thirty SS troops and a number of houses.
