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I -- SILVER STAR. Pursuant to authority contained in AR 600-45, dated 22 September 1943, as amended, and Circular 6, Headquarters Third United States Army, 26 April 1944, a Silver Star is awarded to the following officers of this command:

Colonel Bernard A Byrne, 012404, Infantry, United States Army, for gallantry in action in the vicinity of * * * and * * *, France on 10 November 1944. On that day Colonel Byrne visited front line elements of his regiment and exposed himself to heavy enemy small arms and artillery fire in order to urge his men forward in the clearance of * * * Woods. Colonel Byrne's command had been stopped by the enemy who had counterattacked with tanks and infantry. He exhibited courage and coolness under fire, moving among his left battalion in order to personally urge them forward. By inspirational leadership, Colonel Byrne's regiment captured * * * Farm and pushed forward to clear the * * * Woods. The gallantry of Colonel Byrne exemplifies the highest traditions of the military forces of the United States. Entered United States Military Academy from Ohio

Colonel Butler B Miltonberger, 0197801, Infantry, United States Army, for gallantry in action in the vicinity of Hill 316 south of * * *, France, on 14 November 1944. When a battalion was without its regular commander due to wounds, Colonel Miltonberger went forward to personally inspire the battalion in the capture of Hill 316. The occupation of this hill was essential as it was the key terrain feature in the vicinity of * * *, and its capture meant the eventual fall of the city. Colonel Miltonberger exposed himself to small arms, artillery and tank fire in order to inspire his men forward, which action contributed to the immediate capture of Hill 316. Colonel Miltonberger's gallantry and his loyal devotion to duty are in keeping with the highest traditions of the military forces of the United States. Entered military service from Nebraska.

Colonel William S Murray, 012227, Infantry, United States Army, for gallantry in action in the vicinity of * * * and * * *, France on 8 November 1944. Colonel Murray had been in command of the * * * Infantry only a few days when this regiment attacked from the * * * Woods to dislodge the enemy from a defensive position which the enemy had been holding and preparing for some five weeks. Colonel Murray on this, his first day of combat command of the regiment, conspicuously placed himself throughout the attack among the forward elements of his troops. He moved among his men and exhibited great coolness under fire, encouraging them forward with such speed as to take his objective with a minimum of casualties. The gallantry of Colonel Murray and his courageous devotion to duty exemplify the highest traditions of the military forces of the United States. Entered United States Military Academy from New Mexico.

First Lieutenant Lyle E Reishus, 01325142, Infantry, United States Army, for gallantry in action near * * *, France on 30 September 1944. When the enemy opened machine gun fire on his platoon positions during a counterattack, Lieutenant Reishus made his way forward toward the left flank of the hostile emplacement, threw two grenades and killed the enemy gunner and his assistant. He then discovered an enemy group of thirty men who were moving along a road in the vicinity and threatened an adjoining unit which was already hard-pressed. Immediately returning to his platoon, he gathered all available men and formed a defensive line which protected part of the adjacent company as well as his own guns and equipment. Lieutenant Reishus displayed such qualities of resourcefulness and intrepid leadership in this action as to reflect high credit upon his character as an officer. Entered military service from Minnesota.

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II -- BRONZE STAR MEDAL. Pursuant to authority contained in AR 600-45, dated 22 September 1943, as amended, and Circular 6, Headquarters Third United States Army, 26 April 1944, a Bronze Star Medal is awarded to the following officers and enlisted men of this command:

Captain Abraham I Gold, 0485380, Dental Corps, United States Army, for heroic service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States near * * * , France on 6 November 1944. While Captain Gold was giving medical assistance to a wounded soldier in a battery aid station, an artillery shell hit the building and exploded inside the room, killing the soldier and several comrades. Captain Gold was flung against a wall, suffering cuts on his hand and face, and temporary loss of hearing in one ear. In spite of his condition, he made his way through the darkness down the stairs to administer first aid to a seriously wounded man, and supervised the evacuation of all casualties. Captain Gold's resourceful actions and disregard for personal welfare reflect credit upon his character as an officer. Entered military service from New York.

First Lieutenant Uber S Adams, 01554626, Ordnance Department, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France from 8 October to 6 November 1944. Entered military service from Pennsylvania.

Technical Sergeant Clyde D Johnson, 14018208, Infantry, United States Army, for heroic service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States near * * * , France on 14 October 1944. Exercising outstanding ingenuity and resourcefulness, Sergeant Johnson, a platoon sergeant, constructed twelve anti-personnel charges from captured German mortar shells and while exposed to enemy fire, advanced approximately two hundred yards ahead of the company lines to place the charges in locations which appeared likely avenues of approach for enemy patrols. Sergeant Johnson's courageous actions and clear thinking under fire reflect credit upon his character and training as a soldier. Entered military service from North Carolina.

Staff Sergeant Isaac W Kendall, 35367044 (then technician fourth grade), Coast Artillery Corps, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France from 18 June to 6 November 1944. Entered military service from Indiana.

Staff Sergeant William M Mack, 17050430, Infantry, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in France from 11 July to 26 October 1944. Entered military service from North Dakota.

Staff Sergeant Chester Mills, 37152752, Infantry, United States Army, for heroic service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States at * * * , France on 10 October 1944. Despite the fact that his position was overrun by enemy tanks and an outnumbering force of infantry, and even after the intensity of the enemy attack resulted in leaving only himself and another soldier, Sergeant Mills, a squad leader, continued to defend his position, with disregard for personal safety and with courage and tenacity of purpose that ultimately enabled assisting troops to repulse the enemy attack. Entered military service from Kansas.

Staff Sergeant Segismundo C Vargas, 39015291, Field Artillery, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in the * * * , France on 10 September 1944. Entered military service from California.

Sergeant George N Mealy, 35321276, Coast Artillery Corps, United States Army, for meritorious service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States in the vicinity of * * * , France on 28 September 1944. Entered military service from Ohio.

Technician Fifth Grade John M McIntosh, 39559099, Medical Department, United States Army, for heroic service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States near * * * , France on 6 November 1944. While Technician McIntosh was on duty at the aid station of Battery A during an enemy artillery barrage, a shell pierced the wall of the building and exploded in the room. Al-

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though he suffered concussion and wounds. Technician McIntosh went to the aid of another wounded man who was unable to move, and administered first aid to him. He then assisted in the evacuation of several other men and remained at his post until the next morning without seeking medical attention. His devotion to duty and disregard for personal welfare reflect credit upon his character as a soldier, and upon the Medical Department of the Army. Entered military service from California.

Technician Fifth Grade Rollie B Shelton, 35131826, Field Artillery, United States Army, for heroic service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States near * * *, France on 17 July 1944. When his own tank destroyer became bogged down during an attack, Technician Shelton voluntarily proceeded on foot with the lead destroyer of the platoon, acting as target spotter. When this destroyer was eventually disabled by mines, he assisted in covering the withdrawal of its crew. He then returned to his own vehicle and worked for two hours while subjected to enemy artillery fire in a successful effort to put the destroyer back into action. Technician Shelton's resourceful and courageous actions reflect credit upon his character and training as a soldier. Entered military service from Ohio.

Private First Class Leo Meehan, 6776124, Infantry, United States Army, for heroic service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States near * * *, France on 22 September 1944. In the vicinity of * * * River, Private Meehan, a pioneer in the Mine Platoon, Antitank Company, * * * Infantry, went forward with his platoon leader to reconnoiter the condition of a bridge crossing the river. Nearing the bridge, Private Meehan and the platoon leader were pinned down by enemy machine gun and mortar fire over flat, open terrain affording the enemy effective fields of fire. When the platoon leader was wounded, and as the enemy fire increased, Private Meehan crawled to the officer and dragged him to a depression offering comparative safety, and then administered first aid, watching over him for a period of more than five hours, until the arrival of aid men who completed the officer's evacuation. Private Meehan's courage, tenacity of purpose and loyalty to a wounded officer, make him an asset to the military service. Entered military service from Washington.

Private First Class Edward M Smith, 37584430, Corps of Engineers, United States Army, for heroic service in connection with military operations against an enemy of the United States near * * *, France on 8 November 1944. Private Smith was a member of a squad engaged in removing enemy mines from a road near * * *, under enemy machine gun and artillery fire emanating from high ground to the right. At about 1000, three members of the squad were wounded. Despite the fact that artillery fire continued to fall in the immediate vicinity, Private Smith immediately went to the aid of a seriously wounded soldier. After applying a tourniquet, he continued with his mission of removing mines, then returned to evacuate the wounded man. While so engaged he was himself wounded by machine gun fire, but managed to remove the wounded soldier to safety. His heroic actions under fire are worthy of emulation. Entered military service from Minnesota.

III -- AIR MEDAL (OAK-LEAF CLUSTER). Pursuant to authority contained in AR 600-45, dated 22 September 1943, as amended, and Circular 6, Headquarters Third United States Army, 26 April 1944, in addition to the Air Medal previously awarded, a bronze Oak-Leaf Cluster is awarded to the following officer of this command:

First Lieutenant John W Ford, 01178147, Field Artillery, United States Army, for meritorious achievement while participating in aerial flight over France during the period 15 September to 15 October 1944. Entered military service from Texas.
