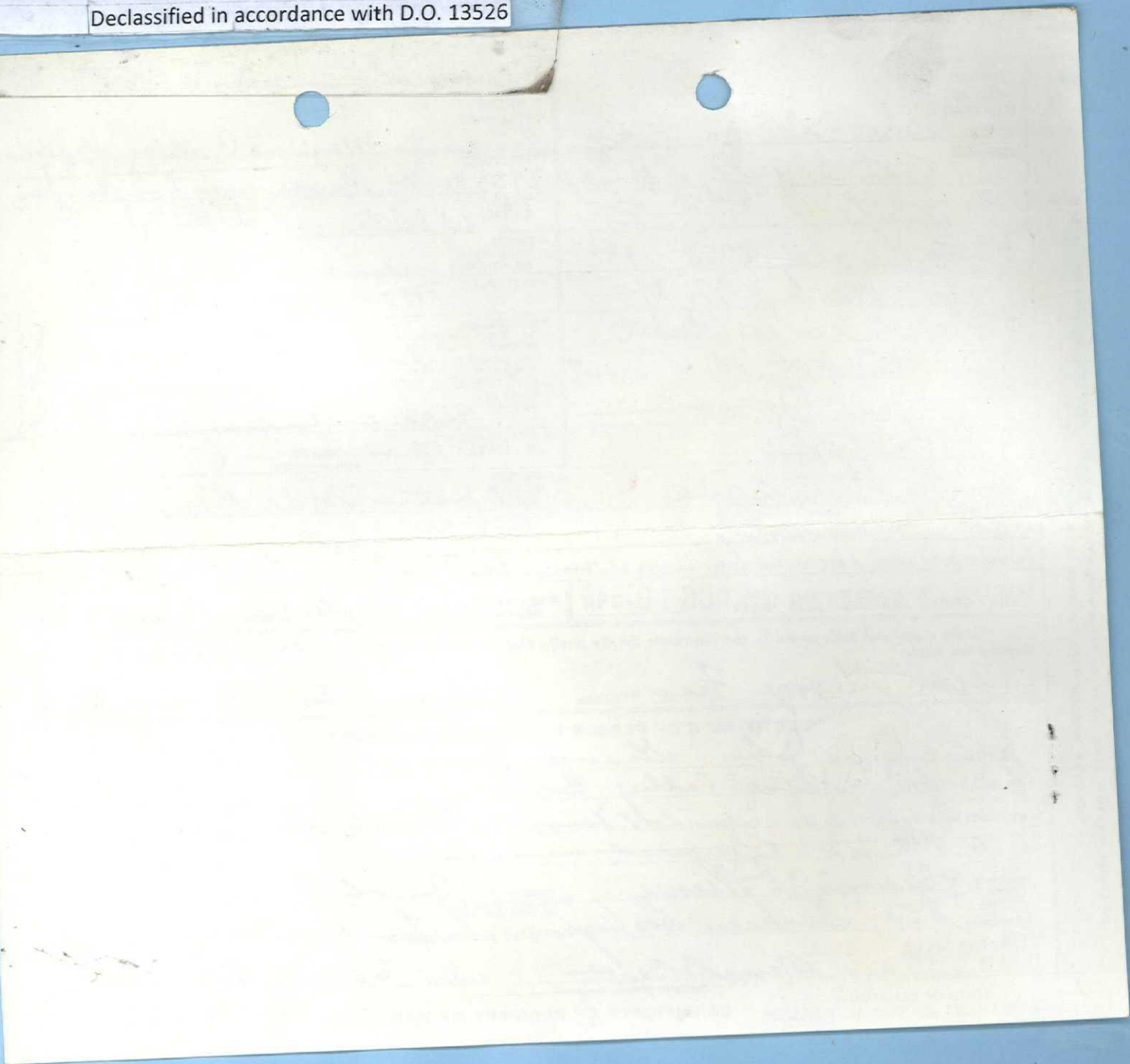

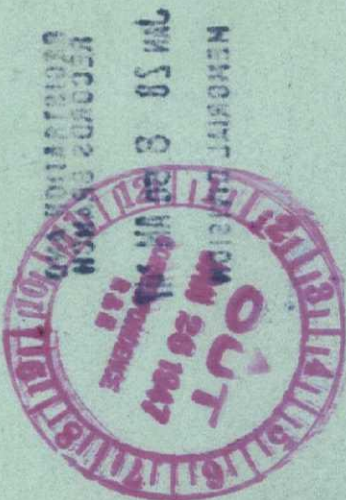

Gentlemen:

This letter will beyond a doubt get no farther than the "front door" of the War Dept., but more than any thing else in the world I hope it gets much farther!

293 On July 20, 1944 my brother, S/Sgt. Allison D. Babb, Co. B, 134 Inf., 35 Div.; was killed in the battle of St. Lo, France. To date my mother, a widow, has not received one word of information concerning the place of burial for him. She learned from other Gold Star Mothers that they had received such news, thus I feel something should be done for her.

I realize that this letter is one in a million, but would deeply appreciate any information that you can furnish me about S/Sgt. Babb's place of burial. 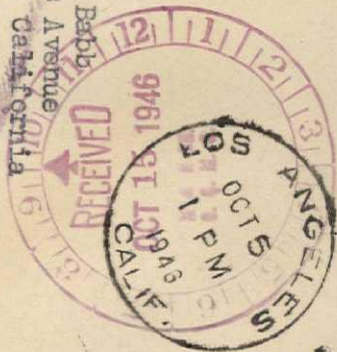

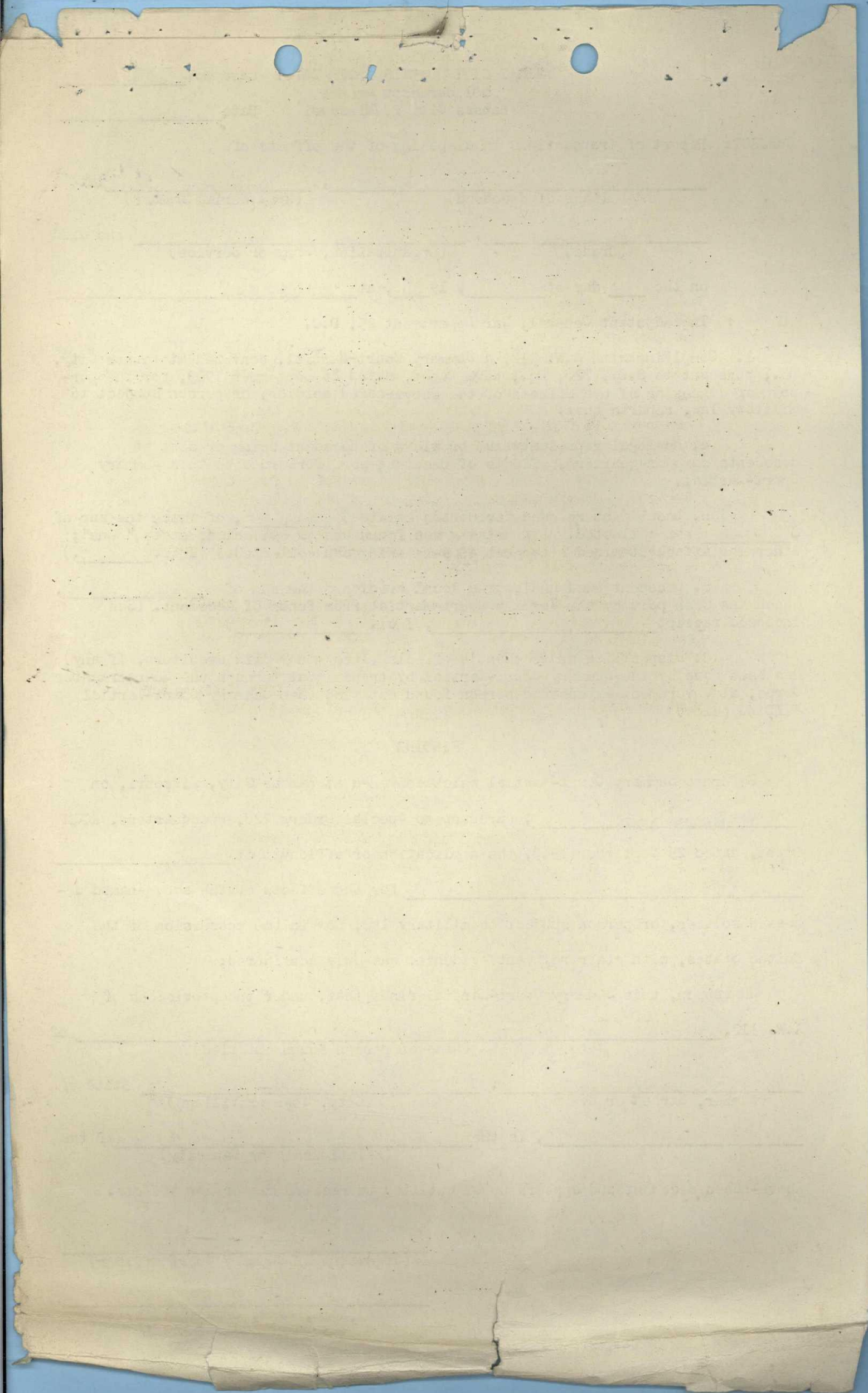
