SYNOPSIS: The casualties listed on attached roster are reported by official records as Missing in Action or Killed in Action during ground or air operations in the department of Moselle, France, from the period 5 September 1944 to 16 March 1945. Extensive area searches as well as individual investigation have to date failed to furnish information as to the ultimate disposition of their remains. Efforts to effect association with unidentified recoveries from the area, now interred in U.S. Military Cemeteries, have also proven negative. The lack of specific information regarding the death or burial, limited search in most instances to general localities, however, documents on file in this Office and Office of The Quartermaster General substantiate the fact that numerous investigations covering the entire department of Moselle have been conducted in the course of search operations for all losses, both recovered and unrecovered. The terrain of the Moselle department, for the most part, consists of farm, pasture and forested areas which has been under constant cultivation and supervision by farmers and forest guards, since the cessation of hostilities, thus the possibility of undiscovered graves is remote. It can therefore be concluded that the remains of the deceased in question were reduced by battle action to a state which precludes recovery or identification. The absence of specific information concerning their deaths, the failure of Field Investigations to provide

evidence and the lack of association with recovered unknowns would tend to substantiate these conclusions. It is recommended that the remains of the individuals listed in these Board Proceedings be considered Non-Recoverable under the provisions of paragraph 3b, Letter, Office of The Quartermaster General, file QMGMP 293, Subject: Processing Board Findings of Non-Recoverability Return of World War II Dead Program, dated 25 March 1949.

Reference is made to: OQMG Forms 371; After Action Reports, and Casualty Clearance Plan; concerning each decedent; Reports of Field Investigations previously forwarded to The Office of The Quartermaster General, pertaining to resolved casualties who were killed in action in the Department of Moselle, France; on file in the Office of The Quartermaster General, Washington, D. 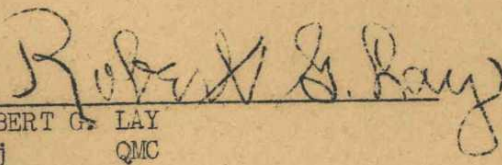

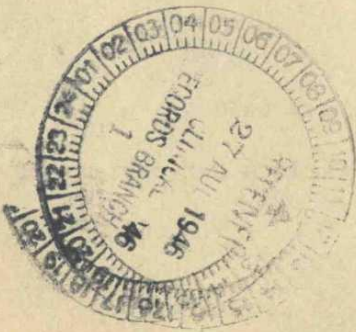

Due to the stress of official business, General Marshall has asked me to reply to your letter of 19 July 1945, in which you request information concerning your son, the late Private First Class Charles E. Clark.

I am most sympathetic with you in your desire to know the details of your son's death, which would offer you some comfort in your sorrow. It is sincerely regretted that the only information received in the War Department concerning his death is that which was contained in the official casualty message forwarded to this office by the Commanding General, European Theater of Operations, which stated that your son was killed in action in France on 10 October 1944. However, as you were previously advised, under a procedure which is presently in effect, the immediate commanding officer or the chaplain is required to send directly to the next of kin or the emergency addressee, a letter containing death circumstances about each person who dies overseas in the service of our country. As it is indicated that you have not yet received a communication of this nature, I have requested the proper military authorities to write to you as soon as possible. You may be certain that every effort will be made to send the desired information expeditiously.

The Quartermaster General, Washington 25, D. C., has jurisdiction over matters pertaining to the burial of our military personnel who die overseas and is charged with the disposition of their personal effects. I have, therefore, asked that official to write to you concerning these matters. As the Administrator of Veterans Affairs, Washington, D. C., handles all matters pertaining to Government insurance and pensions to dependents of deceased personnel, I have forwarded a copy of your letter to that official with the request that direct reply be made to you.

Your sacrifice is great, I know, and you have my heartfelt sympathy. It is hoped that you will find comfort in the knowledge that your son's heroic service has earned him a lasting place in the grateful memory of our country.

Dear Sir;

I am writting to you at this time, hoping that you may be able to help me out in some way. I would appreciate it very much if you could.

My son was killed in action in France last October 10, 1944. I received word on October 24 that he was missing, then on January 14, I received word that he had been killed the same day he was reported missing. Later I was told a letter would follow giving the details. I have now waitted since January 14 and have received no word.

I as the boys mother would like to know something. I don't even know where he is buried or how he was killed, also have not received any of his personal belongings backs as some people have.

I also have another matter to call to your attention. In March of this year I filed the necessary papers for Insurance and Pension and up to the present time have received nothing. I wrote to a party in the claims division by the name of Hinton that was about 3 weeks ago in regard to matters and asked for word when I would start to receive something. So far no reply.

I have no means of income and am not able to work. Have been Doctoring for the past 18 years and still go to the Doctor every week. I have just gotten up out of a sick bed and I am not feeling any to well, but I just had to write to you General Marshal, and see what could be done. I am a widow and souly depended on my sons support. The only one I had.

Now I really dont know where I am at. I am pretty much despondent in regards to the matter. I think I have been pretty patient so far and not annoyed any one by writting to them in reference to the Insurance and Pension (I mean the Veterans Administration).

I know they must be pretty busy. I wish I could hear something soon.

I want to thank you for your card of sympathy you sent me some time ago. I have put it away for safe keeping. I had only the one boy to give to serve his country, so I only hope he made a good soldier. We where very much devoted to one another. And he sure did what was right by me since his father died 6 years ago. I am trying to do the best I can to for get, but some how it seems it will take a long time.

I hope we will soon finish the Japs as we did with Germany. I know our boys can do it. It may take a little time, but I dont think we have failed yet. So lots of Good Luck to you General Marshall and all the men an boys under you.

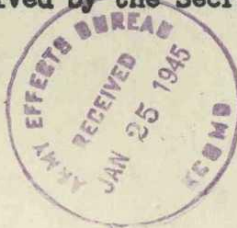

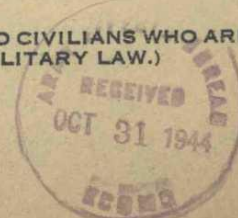

Dear Sir;

I am writting to you at this time, hoping that you may be able to help me out in some way. I would appreciate it very much if you could.

My son was killed in action in France last October 10, 1944. I received word on October 24 that he was missing, then on January 14, I received word that he had been killed the same day he was reported missing. Later I was told a letter would follow giving the details. I have now waitted since January 14 and have received no word.

I as the boys mother would like to know something. I don't even know where he is buried or how he was killed, also have not received any of his personal belongings backs as some people have.

I also have another matter to call to your attention. In March of this year I filed the necessary papers for Insurance and Pension and up to the present time have received nothing. I wrote to a party in the claims division by the name of Hinton that was about 3 weeks ago in regard to matters and asked for word when I would start to receive something. So far no reply.

I have no means of income and am not able to work. Have been Doctoring for the past 18 years and still go to the Doctor every week. I have just gotten up out of a sick bed and I am not feeling any to well, but I just had to write to you General Marshal, and see what could be done. I am a widow and souly depended on my sons support. The only one I had.

Now I really dont know where I am at. I am pretty much despondent in regards to the matter. I think I have been pretty patient so far and not annoyed any one by writting to them in reference to the Insurance and Pension (I mean the Veterans Administration).

I know they must be pretty busy. I wish I could hear something soon.

I want to thank you for your card of sympathy you sent me some time ago. I have put it away for safe keeping. I had only the one boy to give to serve his country, so I only hope he made a good soldier. We where very much devoted to one another. And he sure did what was right by me since his father died 6 years ago. I am trying to do the best I can to for get, but some how it seems it will take a long time.

I hope we will soon finish the Japs as we did with Germany. I know our boys can do it. It may take a little time, but I dont think we have failed yet. So lots of Good Luck to you General Marshall and all the men an boys under you.
