

TACTICAL INTERROGATION REPORT
IFW ~~TAMM~~ 60-B, 134TH INFANTRY

3 Oct 44

2 PW from 2nd Co, 1st Bn, 1125th Regt, 559th Div.

The 1st Bn of the 1125th arrived in ~~KMM~~ our 3rd Bn area early yesterday morning. Before the men had a chance to dig in, our artillery shells landed right on top of them and in the resulting panic the Germans dispersed in the woods. These two prisoners dug holes in the wood and stayed in them all day long, having no idea where their company could be, and at nightfall walked over to the American line to give themselves up.

PW estimate the strength of the 2nd Co, before it suffered many casualties yesterday, at 90-100 men.

The battalion had marched during the night in a NW direction for about 7 km, and came from around Salennes. PW state that his battalion had not been engaged previously, but was in reserve and moved position every night for several nights past. The men received only three hours sleep per night and are very disgusted with such treatment.
