1. SUMMARY: This report contains information on the activities of the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) in the field of the study of the effects of the atomic bomb on the human body. The information is based on a review of the literature and on the results of the CIA's own research. The report is divided into two main parts: the first part deals with the effects of the atomic bomb on the human body, and the second part deals with the effects of the atomic bomb on the environment.
